

NOVEMBER, 1904.—45th Week.

3 Thursday (308-58)

Bright sunshiny day: variable winds Barometer 761  
Had on Rodeo Mistafar over 3000  
Castrated 32 bulls: marked 61 calves  
Cattle looking awful bad yet and still dying  
Salto pulling weeds in garden: so much water  
that nothing else can be done in the chacra  
Butchered cow

4 Friday (309-57)

Warmish day variable wind Bar 760  
Rodeo del Medio 4000  
marked 35 calves: Parted 35 seres. & Plantet 1 Hortenseck  
and put them in Patros Salado:  
Castrated 25 bulls dehorned 4  
Hauled some hay skinned 1 cow  
Manuel Vera here to a right troop of seres  
from J Sanchez (1503) all sorts  
Two of Lueiro's carts hauled on way back

5 Saturday (310-56)

A bit cooler south wind. Barometer 762  
Rodeo Estancia {1100 arriba} marked 17 calves  
Castrated 36 bulls. dehorned 2 bulls  
Put 6 seres and 3 cows for Plantet in Patros Salado  
Hauling hay: hilling potatoes and ploughing  
fruit trees. Recorrimos 3 dead animals



NOVEMBER, 1904.—46th Week.

Rained 1<sup>mm</sup>; South Wind Barometer 748: <sup>23rd</sup> after Trinity. Had Poles Salado  
Castrated 27 bulls. Marked 33 calves. Put 20 peas and 4 afenas  
in Potos Salado. skinned 4 bulls. Butchered cow  
8:30 P.M. is raining now:

7 Monday (312-54)

Cool south wind in early morning. Warm afterwards  
Barometer 759. did not rain much last night  
Marked Zambero calves at Estancia, Mistolar and Paso  
Calchaqui 24 in all. also castrated 8 bulls  
Balbueno cutting alfalfa. Two men hilling Potatoes  
Salto cleaning fruit trees  
Two more of Ezerio's carts passed on return journey

Warm cloudy day 8 Tuesday (313-52): South wind  
Jordan cutting hay. Elias and all the gente hauling  
8:30 P.M.: Plenty of thunder and lightning in the south  
Butchered cow

9 Wednesday (314-52)

The weather appears more settled. South wind Barometer 763  
Finished cutting alfalfa and Johnson grass and began  
cutting weeds in new alfalfa:  
Hilling Potatoes. Raking and shocking hay  
recommenced camp skinned one cow and one CP  
of Andres here for night



NOVEMBER, 1904.—46th Week.

10 Thursday (315-51)

Warmish: light S.E. and E wind. Barometer 762  
Had to take the hay out of galpas and dry it again as  
it was heating. put it back and hauled some more  
Began stack of Johnson grass in potrero  
Jordan cutting weeds in new alfalfa  
Fillon found here at midday  
one dead bull:

11 Friday (316-50) Half Quarter Day.

Nice Pleasant day: East wind. Barometer 759  
Finished hauling hay and Johnson grass  
Cutting weeds all day in new alfalfa  
Elias went to Calchaqui this afternoon  
Butchered cow

12 Saturday (317-49)

Cold South wind Barometer 755  
Rainfall 1<sup>mm</sup>:  
Finished cutting weeds in new alfalfa  
Two carts hauling weeds  
Mr. Richards putting springs on trap  
Two dead calves



NOVEMBER, 1904.—47th Week.

South wind<sup>13</sup> Sunday (318-48) 24th after Trinity. Barometer 761  
Elias brought correspondence. Letter from  
M<sup>rs</sup> Benitz {St Louis}

14 Monday (319-47)

Nice cool weather: south wind. Barometer 765  
Finished hauling weeds out of new alfalfa  
Also finished killing sweet potatoes  
Elias and 3 peones went up to Palmar to see  
Rodeo tomorrow  
Salto in quinta: Butchered cow

15 Tuesday (320-46)

Fine spring weather light south wind Barometer 763  
Rodeo Patro Palmar: Parted 14 novillos of mormon  
1 of Barber's 2 of Hartenski's 1 cow cow distinct flannel and  
Put them in Patro Salado: also Parted and castrated  
12 young bulls: Counted novillos 1062:  
Salto and two peones working in quinta  
Balbuena began flaying mair

16 Wednesday (321-45)

Fine day, north wind. Barometer 760  
Gents all went to Loma taking 11 flannel  
cows: 3 mares & 1 young which Elias castrated  
Jordan counted shorn sheep at J. Medero's 1250  
Sent ox cart after wool and hides  
Salto with horse cart went to town



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NOVEMBER, 1904.—47th Week.

17 Thursday (322-44)

Warm 33°. North wind. Barometer 763.  
Had on rodeo Loma Pai 3,000  
Parted and put in Patrons 6 cows & planted?  
Parted quite a lot of old and bad color cows  
for *carraño*  
Castrated 12 young bulls dehorned 1

18 Friday (323-43)

Warmer 34½° north wind. Barometer 765  
Rodeo Tafera: 1500: } Jordan did not attend  
went up to Palmar. received wool, hides, etc?  
Parted quite a lot of ones castrated 24 bulls

19 Saturday (324-42)

Warmish day northeast wind. Barometer 763  
Had on Rodeo Mitata 5000: Parted quite a lot  
ones and put them together with those of the  
Tafera and Loma Pai 120. in Patrons salads also  
put 28 cows & planted? and 5 of afenos in there  
Balleros still blowing maize  
Salto got back with *stus* *corrundera* etc



NOVEMBER, 1904.—48th Week.

20 Sunday (325-41) Last after Trinity.

Warm 36° North wind. Barometer 761  
Carnado Naca

21 Monday (326-40)

Hot Storm from South: Rainfall 8 <sup>mm</sup>  
Warm at night and threatening Bar 75.8  
Jordan went to Calchagui to consult M<sup>r</sup>.  
William Beniz about camp:  
two dead bulls  
Sanchez here for night  
Elias and gente went up to Palmar  
to float Pelms:

22 Tuesday (327-39)

Rainfall 33.5 mm. Barometer 760  
Salto replanting potatoes  
dead calf in corral

23 Wednesday (328-38)

Weather more settled. Bar 762:  
Jordan got back from Calchagui  
could get no answer from M<sup>r</sup>. Beniz  
Gente still at Palmar  
D Collins here for night  
3 dead cows. two of them C.P.  
Salto in garden: Balbuena making gate



NOVEMBER, 1904.—48th Week.

24 Thursday (329-37)

Swelling day 34<sup>o</sup> Stormy late in afternoon from south  
Rainfall 21 mm. Balderns recurring  
Salt in garden. Balderns odd jobs  
Madero got back from Calchaqui with stores etc  
Elias returned from Palmas at night having  
~~etc~~ started 3 rafts of Palmas  
Callins still here

25 Friday (330-36) south wind  
Rainfall 1 mm. Barometer 761  
Elias and quite left the rafts 3 of them all  
hung up at different places. cant get them loose  
Water still rising  
one dead bull near Estancia  
Sent chasque after correspondance  
Butchered cow

26 Saturday (331-35)

Friday south wind Barometer 761  
Jordan went over to Hartenecks camp to  
see about getting camp for novillos  
Elias and quite recurring  
4 dead animals  
Footmen hauling wood  
Chasque brought correspondance



NOVEMBER, 1904.—49th Week.

27 Sunday (332-34) 1st in Advent.

Sultry day. Barometer 760: no wind  
Jordan got back. got camp. Butchered cow

28 Monday (333-33)

Warm day north<sup>west</sup> wind: Barometer dropped from 760 to 755.  
At 12 wind changed to south strong with rain 19.3 mm  
Jordan, Elias, Richards, Wallis and all the Peones went up  
to Palmar and took novillos {1098} over to campo  
grande {Hartneck} on account of rain could not get  
back: Lake still rising

29 Tuesday (334-32)

Not so warm no wind to speak of Barometer 760  
All the gente returned today: secured camp  
Skinned 5 animals & C.P. Mr. Richards  
on Peonov: John Collins eat dinner here  
Salto cleaning potatoes: Balbuena sick

30 Wednesday (335-31) S. Andrew, Ap. S. Andrew's Day.

Rained slowly all afternoon 3 mm Barometer 760  
Light south wind  
Rodeo Salado: Parted 28 of the biggest novillos  
novillos and put the rest 684 head in of Sanchez  
camp: Elias herded them all day and  
put them on rodeo at night:  
Skinned 2 cows 1 C.P.  
Butchered cow



DECEMBER, 1904.—49th Week.

1 Thursday (336-30)

Pleasant day. Light south wind. Barometer 762  
Rodeo Algorobal: took 477 head to Sanchez's camp  
gente fattening them and receiving  
Skinned 3 found 2 C.P.  
Balbuena and Salto working potatoes and garden  
Report 1 dead in Julian's camp  
Received wool and hides: Paso Calchagui and Mistolar

2 Friday (337-29)

Pleasant day, very light south wind. Barometer 760  
Gente receiving camp. Skinned 6 cows 1 C.P.  
One footman drying wool and cleaning patio  
Jordan putting up hocks  
Salto and Balbuena in garden and potatoes  
Sent Chasque after correspondence

3 Saturday (338-28)

Seems very warm but only marks 32°. Bar 759  
From Rodeo Estancia took about 800 perhaps more  
to camp of Sanchez: Cattle that are there some  
days appear much better  
Salto and Balbuena in sweet potatoes  
Skinned 1 cow  
Report that all the <sup>putted</sup> novillas have escaped from  
Hartuneda's camp: going over to see tomorrow



DECEMBER, 1904.—50th Week.

8 Thursday (343-23)

South wind Barometer 763  
Had on rodeo in J Sanchez's camp. Parted  
38 bulls {Sanchez} and took them to his house  
where he was castrating.  
Baltuero and Ceirillo mended gate and cancella  
near Patro Salado Afterwards cleaning Paraiso trees  
at Baltuero's house.  
Mr Collins left today for Guero.  
Butchered cow

9 Friday (344-22)

Warm day light south wind Barometer 764  
Recomiendo camp 2 dead calves C.P.  
Rodeo Patro Salado Parted 25 cows planted  
Baltuero Ceirillo and Salto cleaning Paraiso  
trees. Elias took correspondence to town

10 Saturday (345-21)

Fine day N.E. Wind Barometer 760  
Mr Benitz returned from states and Europe today  
Baldmero took 23 cows down to planted some Pai  
and on return skinned 3 animals and found 1 C.P.  
Baltuero cutting alfalfa  
Cart brought up 15 cow hides from Mistolar  
Salto in quinta. two helpers in evening  
Don Canute here tonight



DECEMBER, 1904.—50th Week.

4 Sunday (339-27) 2nd in Advent.

Pleasantly cool threatening rain south wind. Barometer 760  
Nothing doing: Received correspondence: post card from  
Mr. Bantz New Orleans

5 Monday (340-26)

Threatening rain all day Barometer 761  
Rainfall 1.7 m. South wind  
Elias, Jordan, Collins and all the camp  
fellows went over to Hartneck's camp to see  
about novillos  
Cirilo and Salto cleaning fruit trees

6 Tuesday (341-25)

Genie came back at night having found  
only a part of the novillos had escaped  
Had rodeo Monday and started 55 next  
had all of the novillos in rodeo  
only a few winning  
South wind Barometer 763  
Butchered cow

7 Wednesday (342-24)

Rained 1.5 m/m Bar 762 South wind  
Reverinto camp skinned 1 calf 1 CP;  
Balbuera finished flewing maize  
Cirilo finished cleaning fruit trees



DECEMBER, 1904.—51st Week.

11 Sunday (346-20) 3rd in Advent.

Warm sunshiny day: light variable wind. Barometer 761  
Balluena raked hay: Butchered cow:

12 Monday (347-19)

Warm: Variable Wind: Barometer 763:  
Threatening rain: south wind and pleasant at night  
Hauling and cutting hay:  
Reconiente camp. Skinned 5 animals 2 C.P.  
Water in lake is falling also in Estero:  
Water is now one inch below fifth mark  
Mr. Collins returned this evening

13 Tuesday (348-18)

Rainfall 6.7 Cool pleasant day: variable wind. Bar. 765  
Very little doing in forenoon on account of rain  
In afternoon cutting hay: and weeds in canaveral  
Elias returned this afternoon bringing correspondence

14 Wednesday (349-17) Ember Day.

Beautiful day: Easterly wind: Barometer 766  
Cutting. Raking and hauling hay  
Rodeo del Media 2.000:  
Put out all the cow ticks to take the dew  
Skinned 1 cow  
Butchered cow



DECEMBER, 1904.—51st Week.

15 Thursday (350-16)

Fine day. Variable winds. Barometer 763  
Finished hauling the hay that was cut  
Refiled the hides and reentered camp  
Skinned 1 cow  
Puesteros here for rations and with Juvenas  
Mr Collins sick all day

16 Friday (351-15) Ember Day.

Another nice day. Variable winds. Barometer 761  
Planted harts and covered hay stack with tips  
Mr Benitz went to Patroio al sud. reports cattle  
in good condition.  
Water in lake falling slowly: is now 2 inches below  
5<sup>th</sup> mark: skinned two calves  
J Andrus Flores here with cart. brought Dona Maria

17 Saturday (352-14) Ember Day.  
Oxford Michaelmas Term ends.

Rained a light shower 5:45<sup>pm</sup> Barometer 760  
Eat in two loafs of hay Fine cool weather for cattle  
Cleaning willow trees  
Reentered camp found nothing dead.  
Butcherd cow



DECEMBER, 1904.—52nd Week.

18 Sunday (353-13) 4th in Advent.

Fine day South wind. Barom 762. <sup>for butcher</sup> Gamma parted out 12 novillos and  
2 of Baldomerus from Sollado potrero. A. was over at J. Sanchez. Elias &  
gente went to rodeos at Los Oves. J. Martin was here. Jordan Collins went  
to Suera.

19 Monday (354-12) Cambridge Michaelmas Term ends.

Warm day north wind. Barometer 758  
Brought the cattle back from J. Sanchez' camp  
that is to say the most of them.  
Water drying very fast in camp.  
Got cart ready to go to Cal laqui terreno  
Salto and Balbuena working in garden

20 Tuesday (355-11)

Warm day 35° north wind. Barometer 758  
Mr. Benitz left for the south.  
Sent Cyrilo with ox cart after stores  
Reconiendo camp: nothing dead!  
Balbuena mending such cart  
Salto and Asturo working in potatoes  
Butchered cow

21 Wednesday (356-10) S. Thomas, Ap. Shortest Day.

Michaelmas Law Sittings end.

Warm day: 37° northeast and north wind Barometer 757  
Threatening rain all afternoon. began at sundown: slowly;  
Pancho and Mateo reconiendo  
Salto in Potato hatch  
Balbuena painted gate Pt Salado and brought  
hicks from J. Bergarra



DECEMBER, 1904.—52nd Week.

22 Thursday (357-9)

It rained last night 4.9  $\frac{w}{m}$  and today 25.5  $\frac{w}{m}$ :  
At 10 tonight is raining again with south wind Bar 754  
In afternoon the footmen worked a little in potatoes  
Cattlemen recommends  
Cattle looking better

23 Friday (358-8)

Fine day light south wind: Barometer 761  
Salto working in potatoes  
Cattle recommends  
Jordan went to Mirator y alcedor {fishing}  
Elias got back at nightfall  
Butchered cow  
Rained last night 1.2  $\frac{w}{m}$

24 Saturday (359-7)

Grand day: no wind. Barometer 765  
Elias and Callin went over to Guero  
Salto and Balbueno in potatoes  
Cattle recommends. skinned 1 calf 1 cow CP  
Cart got back with stus etc. no correspondence



DECEMBER, 1904.—53rd Week.

25 Sunday (360-6) Christmas Day. 763  
Pleasant day: north wind: Barometer  
Elias and gente went to J. Sanchez to attend rodeo merano  
Mr. Richards returned: Received correspondence (Matthes)

26 Monday (361-5) S. Stephen, M. Bank Holiday.

Bright day northeast wind Barometer 762  
Elias and gente brought 145 head of cattle back  
from J. Sanchez: and went on to Yuma to part  
novillos tomorrow:  
Bellwens cut and raked the last piece of alfalfa  
Jordan recommends camp & pasture Palmar &  
Salto. Cyrils and wallis in potato patch

27 Tuesday (362-4) S. John, Evan.  
Rainfall 14 m/m: late afternoon and night. Barometer 760  
did not rain any at Yuma Pai  
Jordan went down to Yuma: Rocks 2500 arriba  
Parted 103 novillos  
Gente at Estancia getting in hay  
Very warm day 36°

28 Wednesday (363-3) Innocents' Day.  
Rather warm: no wind: Barometer 760  
Rocks Tafra 2000 escape Parted 39 novillos  
Rocks Mistolar 5000 arriba Parted 84 novillos  
Shut them in at Mistolar  
Jordan Elias and some of the men came to  
Estancia:  
Salto in potato patch



DECEMBER, 1904.—53rd Week.

29 Thursday (364-2)

Warm day 35°. No wind. Barometer 762  
Had on rodeo del medio: 3000+ Parted 87  
Novillas and then and those that were parted  
these last days: Salto flowing in fruit trees  
hauled 1 load of wood  
wrote to M<sup>rs</sup> Benitz (Rosario)  
Fillon packed with canoe going to Salado  
Butchered cow

30 Friday (365-1)

Same heat as yesterday with n.e. wind. Bar. 760  
Rodeo Estancia 1500: Parted 32 novillas and  
81 cows: and took them to Patroo Palmar  
Also castrated 4 little bulls:  
Salto still flowing in fruit trees  
Sent Chesque to town (Mateo)

31 Saturday (366)

Warm day: North East wind. Barometer 761  
Rodeo Salado 500. Parted 13 novillas and 49 cows  
and put them in Patroo Palmar  
also cured 3 oxen that were embuechados  
Chesque brought correspondence  
letter from M<sup>rs</sup> Benitz (Bellvillo)
