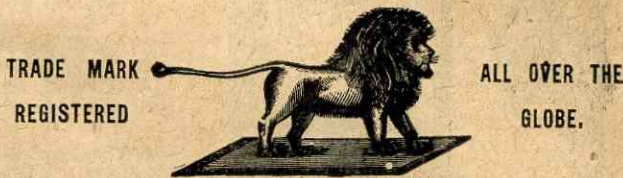

AMPUTATION'S VICTIM.

ARTHUR PAYNE, 65, Bride Street, Barnsbury, N.—A boy threw a stone and hit him on the finger over six years ago; it swelled but did not bleed; was taken to a doctor (Mr. Donald, parish doctor of Islington), and was under his treatment two years, gradually getting worse. 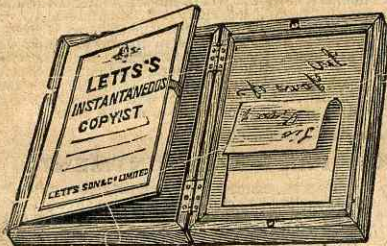
