All hands killing locusts. got up a cart load of alfalfa hay to burn the locusts.

Antonio Asdel paid his year's rent 300. & we also regulated the ac. we had with him.

2 FRIDAY [2-363]

Another hot day, strong north wind. All hands killing locusts, and trying to keep them out of the granary.

Received two cart loads of wheat as the sent two crates with 70 bags and horse cart with 20 bags. Sent the station part of 150 bags of wheat sold to Bellinghish at 7.25 to 100¢. horse cart sent back 50 tubs spence and 1 box sheep dip. Hayward, sent out from Rosario by the Ten Manuel came back from taking the traps to D.M. &

Mrs. & Macintosh and brother went back to Rosario.

Two ladies, Mrs. Hunt and Mrs. Jones, came out from Rosario with, they a while on a visit. Johnnie went through the Tupper patches.

worked carpentering on the sheep dip all afternoon.

Ordered a new saddle at 15.00 he is to bring it 5 weeks.

3 SATURDAY [3-362]
(10^h 12^m A.M.)

Hot north wind, looked stormy in the evening. Sent Gustaf to the station with horse cart 20 bags wheat, sent back 1 barrel of cement and 7 bags bran.

Received 4 cart loads of wheat as the. Three from killing locusts all day. Macintosh killing and Johnnie carpentering.

hatched a noveris, will cut up its back &.

4 SUNDAY—2 aft Christmas [4-361]

A strong gumpus last night, rained about on hour, got beautifully cool. Turned the water into the sheep dip.

6 TUESDAY [6-359]

Epiphany. Twelfth Day. Old Christmas Day

Two trojas locked in for the night.
Dutchman a novillias \heartsuit
Sent 40 bags in 2 trips with horse cart to the station to
Bottleigh, but back 1 bag sugar, three one inch boards
and some nails.
Mr Bottleigh and Don Luis came over to tea.
Cadies drove to the Teyous.
Mother's birth day.
From burning locusts.

7 WEDNESDAY [7-358]

Fine cool day. All hands killing locusts. received
wheat from colonists as $\frac{1}{2}$ o.
Mr Hall here for the night.
a troja from the 51 shut in for the night.
Anacleto began to dig a new well in the horse
potrow.

A pretty warm day. reared wheat.
 Sifted a mortar.
 Mr Wang and Mr Hill had breakfast here.

 Sent horse cart to the station for a little cement.

9 FRIDAY [9-356]

Fire Insurance Days of Grace expire

Very warm forenoon. in the afternoon a storm came up
 and it rained a little and cooled off nicely.
 killed locusts. and reared three loads of wheat.
 brought up the old maver from the pasture and
 killed one for the pigs.
 William M. Johnston and Mr Judson arrived in a hired carriage
 from the station.

10 SATURDAY [10-355]

3²⁵ P.M.

Beautiful day. Took the visitors around the Tupper.
 killed a fat lamb, and skinned a piece in the gristle.
 mason finished the sheep dip. mixed the dipping powder
 and put it in.
 Killed a little sucking pig.

11 SUNDAY—1 aft Epiph [11-354]

Quite a warm day. The ladies all went to Botolphclaydon for
 breakfast.
 brought up the flock of sheep from the Tupper and the
 flock from the Pig man pasture.
 Mr Johnston had a lot of chocolate.

Hilary Law Sittings begin

It was a warm day. Johnie and William and Mr Jensen and Mr Anderson left for Pioneer Spring. Beasaca went with them. Herman and the two cart men hauled wheat the whole day. Anacleto and Chivero took some boards down to the potrero well and hauled bricks to the well. This afternoon Berttinger came over to tea here. Gustaf came back and is working again here. Juan Larra has shut a trap in our corral.

13 TUESDAY [13-352]

This morning it was fine warm day. We dipped all our sheep and Mr Macintosh's sheep also. Mother drove over to the town and took the ladies along with her. This afternoon we set over poens at digging the new well. Ceja and Anclio hauled bricks all day long. We butchered a young calf. Herman went over to the station and argued the accounts there. Herman has received \$2800 from Ricardo Fontaine for mules.

14 WEDNESDAY [14-351]

Oxford Hilary Term begins

This morning it was a day it looked stormy. Herman and Manuel took a trip of horse and went in to the Chapinor camp looking for some stolen horses and found three horses. This afternoon Herman and Manuel came back. We butchered a calf. The poens are still at work at the well in the poor potreros. Mr Robson went after the mail and bread we did not get any more wheat to day. And seven sheep died at Pinar.

This morning it was very warm day yesterday Donald skinned ten sheep and today he skinned six sheep that died from the dipping. Don Ricardo Fronteira came and wanted to know whether he should shut in our carrall. Herman looked after the ponies digging the well. Herman went over to the town after the mail.

The ponies are still at work at the well. We did not receive any wheat today but seven came looking for work. Qualls gave his tropo water at the sugarcane well. Ventura was here he came for meat.

16 FRIDAY [16-349]

This morning it got cloudy and it rained nearly the whole day long. The ponies worked half a day today. Mr Macintosh had left early here to go and work for Berthelme.

Don Ricardo Fronteira is still here. Herman and Don Ricardo went over to San Lomas to get a certificate made for the novillo. We butchered a cow. Jose Rivarero is staying here with a tropo. We got one hundred bags ready to send for train.

17 SATURDAY [17-348]

3⁰ 18⁰ A.M.

This morning it was a fine day. Mr Robson took Don Ricardo over to the station. Mr Robson also sent the one hundred bags to Mr Hill in Carrania. Herman set ponies to work at the well. Herman took Sepe with oxcart and received wheat from Padre Paulino. We also received wheat from another colonist.

18 SUNDAY—2 aft Epiph [18-347]

It was a fine day. Herman went and looked for some turneps etc. We butchered a cow. Robson went to the San Lomas but no one was at home. Two colonists were here to see if Johnie had come back yet.

This morning it was very warm day
 Herman set poles at halting bricks to the well,
 Herman and Sepa went and received wheat
 from Pedro Puellos. This afternoon all hands at
 work at the well. The two masons commenced
 to brick the well, Sepa hauled wheat to the
 house. Manuel came back this evening to the
 Mr Robson and Herman put a colt from
 Lomas camp into our pithers.

Donald skinned three of our sheep and one of
 Mr Macintoshes sheep. Mother drove to the
 Rosar town with Min Ferni.

20 TUESDAY [20-346]

This morning it was very cloudy day it
 commenced to rain and it rained nearly all day
 long. We butchered a calf. Sepa and Gervasio
 brought up a big load of alfalfa.
 Chivero and Avilanes hauled bricks to the well
 Aracete and the two masons worked at the
 well. This afternoon we did not work at
 the well. We put the poles at chasing
 langostas out of the quinta. The masons
 are white washing the back coridor yet.
 The water pulling boy has left the Espanna
 Gustaf is still here he tends to the pigs

21 WEDNESDAY [21-344]

This morning it was very ^{warm} ~~wet~~ day.
 We put the poles at burning langostas
 Herman and Sepa went and received
 wheat from a colonist.
 In afternoon Chivero and Gervasio
 hauled bricks to the new well.
 Herman took Sepa and Avilanes
 with ox carts and received wheat from the
 pigman.
 Johnie came home in the evening
 from Buenos Ayres.

Fine good day cloudy. All hands chasing locusts out of the prairie. Got up cutting alfalfa for the pigs, and doing other jobs about the place.

Sent to the station for the wagonettes that Johnnie bought in D.K. for 640.00. Killed one of Don Jones' haddens for the pigs. Sutchred a railleona.

Our mailies arrived from the Chaco. 8 men 15 days on the road. a troupe from the Victoria looked in also.

Mother and the ladies went out driving in new carriage.

23 FRIDAY [33-342]

Fine day. Took the mailies to the Tijera potato pits, and counted them. 485 animals, of which 2 are bullocks and four cows.

In the evening Johnnie went to the Refugio and back.

Bought a yearling bull for 150.00 thoroughbred.

Alfred arrived from the Chaco by the evening train.

Brought a lot of skins with him.

Sutchred a calf

24 SATURDAY [34-341]

Very hot day. had a slight shower in the afternoon. all hands working putting the boards out the wall in the horse potato. Alfred and Johnnie recovered the potatoes. sent horse cart to the station. Bought over 100 bags of lime. Bought in Cascaravia for the mill.

25 Septuagesima SUNDAY [35-340]

Conversion of St. Paul. 0^h 25^m A.M.

Very hot day. Bought up all the Barbours horses for the Tijera and marked them 4.1. in all.

also bought up the potatoes, and put out five potato for Alfred to take to the Chaco. also the two potato

horses hechores. Mr. Nash and a Mr. Williams saw all day. made Mr. Nash a present of a hand potato. Sutchred a mil.

Partly weather. hot in the forenoon and dusty, south wind in the afternoon.

Mr Ray and Mr Fair came to see their mailer K.

The tiga peas went back to the Chaco. took all the Indian horses along. also two mules from Wab. a big tiga gave water today.

poisoned all the hides. Maolita working at new work. Luvins getting up around the Sebida in the south parties.

Herman received wheat 7/10.

27 TUESDAY [37-338]

Fine day, rained nearly all day hard. finest and best rain we have had for eight months.

a boy from Chupino brought notice that some mailer from the Tiga were down there.

28 WEDNESDAY [38-337]

Johnie and three men went to look for the mailer. found 63 stolen still missing. sent four in the afternoon to look for them found eight. have 3 missing. Rained hard nearly all night. heard h.

Sutekwot a rattle.

received the lot cartload of wheat. wet had to put it on a load to dry.

Appd and Johnie went all around all the parties. also over to Bittlinges.

Beautiful day. Mother and Alfred went to C. de Arroyo, captured 30 snake pigs. Currais getting up around tubidas. Anacleto finishing work at home patch well. Gustaf also worked there half a day.

Sutched a cow.

Herman very bad with tooth ache.

Sent carriage to the station to bring back Mother and Alfred but they did not come.

Manuel and his brother camped the 3 mos all day, only found one.

30 FRIDAY [30-335]

Beautiful day. dipped the sheep in south patch. Sent flat counted them after picking out some capons to put down to the Tijera 273 ewes. also dipped Macintator sheep after parting out capons counted 156.

Sutched the old sheep that had ringer on their udders.

peons mended stocks and hunted Cera de vaca.

José's dove mother and Alfred and a Miss Pion from the station.

Herman went to Roaio to have his teeth fixed. one of the Colonia Vega novillia died empastado.

31 SATURDAY [31-334]

Brought up the poorest sheep dipped them and culled out 29 ewes and put them into best flock making 402 in best flock, and counted the poorest sheep 404 in all. also brought up the capons from the Tijera and dipped them 420 capons.

Sutched 4 old sheep. Gustaf worked all day at the Tijera.

Peon mended fence. Feb Sexagesima SUNDAY [32-333]
Partridge and Pheasant Shooting ends

Beautiful day. Adjusted all accounts with the peons and after they pay them 50 cent 5 the day or 15.00 monthly. Mother and Miss Pion done over to Berthelings.

Herman came back from Roaio brought Miss B. Muntah back with him. Sutched a novilla

Candlemas, Purification V. Mary, Scotch
Quarter Day. 6^h 12^m A.M.

Beautiful day. Sent Manuel and his brother to the Rapids with some men to fetch a bull that Johnnie bought from Nash.

Two men worked chasing locusts.

Alfred and Johnnie went to the Garrauca in the afternoon.

a small cow calf fell into the well and drowned.

3 TUESDAY [31-331]

Very hot salty day. passed the brass miller from No 1 potter into No 2. as yet splendid there. counted the amount of 82 brought up three sledges and 4 cow lever \$45 in that lot.

put the 3 sledges into joggans potter and the 4 cows into stack potter. all the potter mixed with the pottermen separated them.

4 WEDNESDAY [35-330]

Rained a little shower last night. very hot and salty all day. locusts dreadfully bad. eating the bark off of all the trees.

butchered a calf. two cows died in last flock.

an oxen began to make a new calf pen.

sold all the wheat that is in the stable galper to Bohling at \$45 the 100 R.

Two traps loked in to night.

Rained very hard last night. flooded everything. thundered a great deal.

Affed went to Rosario.

Ricardo Fontana paid 63 mos at 28 = 1,764. he paid 1,400 for the traps taken last time. owes us for this. butchered a marmoset.

a colonist Frederico Basso has brought his seed wheat to the Estancia to be taken care of for him.

6 FRIDAY [37-328]

Quite a cold night last night. and a beautiful day today.

Wauling bricks. masons making calf pen. sent horse out to station to fetch. 10 bags flour and semita from mill at Cascaiana. also from Pequeto. 2 one inch boards and 3 trunks 2x2 and 2x3.

Macintosh came back from Dosta.

skinned a sheep in big potter.

Scout came flying very thick late at night, and settled on the trees in the garden and with their wings broke a great number of limbs off of the biggest trees.

Mr. Wab sent the night bull that John picked out then and took the other on ~~on~~ SATURDAY [38-327] away.

Fine day. masons building calf pen still.

Took the new bull and introduced them to his cows at the punto.

a colonist or died in horse potter. skinned it and brought up the meat for the pigs. Macintosh rode to C. de J. and back. Affed came back from Rosario.

8 Quinquagesima SUNDAY [39-326]

Half Quarter Day

Affed caught in Rosario. 20 quiritals No 9 wire at 840 and at C. de Loney, 280 wooden saultas at 30 cuts.

Mother and ladies down up to the pulperia.

Affed and Johnie went to La Sombra.

butchered a small animal.

● 2^d 12^h A.M.

Very warm day. began to haul wheat to the station
with two sullock carts and one horse cart.
made the trip 202 bags.
Mason still working on calf pen and cowden.

10 Shrove TUESDAY [41-324]

Very hot sultry day. sent 9 loads of wheat to
the station.
Sutched a novellio.
Mother and ladies drove to the station.

11 Ash WEDNESDAY [42-323]
First Day of Lent

A slight storm last night, rained a little.
longer ten going away.
Sent ~~the~~ one trip of wheat to the station.
Mrs Stone arrived from London on a visit.
sold the rest of the wheat at Birtley at 9.00 the 100 R.

Carted wheat with 2 ox carts and 1 horse cart all day.
Alfred went to the Santa Catalina.

13 FRIDAY [44-321]

Rained quite a heavy shower last night, could not cart wheat only in the afternoon four loads.
Butchered a novillia, took a butcher a Mr Ward to the Tigris showed him the cattle there.
Alfred came back from the Victoria.

14 SATURDAY [45-320]

Valentine, Bp. Old Candlemas Day

Very hot sultry day. Finished up pen and cleared up the rubbish, sent 8 cart loads of wheat to the station.
took some liches back to the punts and brought up others.
Mr Elliot and Mr Lammie called on in the evening.
Paid Lammie 300.0 as our subscription to Burns' badge.
P. Cuffie paid his ac here.

15 SUNDAY—1 in Lent [46-319]

Ember Week. } 6^h 30^m - 2.15.

17 TUESDAY [48-317]

Alfred and the men went to the Independencia and
 brought in a novillia.
 Mr. Hart arrived from the station.

18 WEDNESDAY [49-316]

Ember Day

Ladies and Herman all drove up to the Cards and
 stayed the day there.
 Macintosh drove Mr. Hart to the Refugio in the little trap.
 All hands worked at the Tijera cleaning out the well.
 Purchased a capon at the Tijera.

Very cold disagreeable day, strong south wind, men hauling bricks to a garden house.

Satched a calf.

Killed one of Do Juan's hellbears Old Finky for the pigs.

20 FRIDAY [51-314]

Ember Day

Beautiful day, but very cold morning, nearly froze last night. Two men ploughing and planting paraiso seeds in the quinta, and two men hauling earth around the pear house. Johnie went to the station and Las Rosas.

ordered some timbo and gink through Puert. Laminacion.

Tropa from Argentina loked in over night, brought as two cows and a novillia from the Argentina.

Satched a cow.

Ladies went out riding.

21 SATURDAY [52-313]

Ember Day

Beautiful day, men sowing paraiso seeds in the quinta, and hauling earth to the pear house.

Set up horses from the Tijeras and put them into the puestoadero. a petro died at the Tijeras.

22 SUNDAY—2 in Lent [53-312]

Very warm day, hot south wind. Mother and Mrs. Thome drove to Las Somas in the afternoon.
Mr. Thome arrived from Couleba

O 7th 15th P.M.

Very hot day. Slaughtered up the three flocks of sheep
parted out the skins to keep them separate. and
pared the sheeps feet and skinned 20 lambs.
butchered two old sheep.

Set the men at making wire netting.

Johns drove Mr and Mrs Thorne and Mrs Macintosh
to La Pover on a visit.

24 TUESDAY [55-310]

St. Matthias, Ap.

Hot day. sultry, looks like rain. Slaughtered up all
four manadas and caught up the stallions to
keep separate. put them into the stable. but
will turn them into the pony pasture.
put Solomon man into goats pasture. Manuago's
into pig man pasture. Mark Custer's into stock pasture
and Mozeppar into horse pasture.
Cylinder and bucket fell into well in south
pasture got it out. also a sheep that fell in.
No Ripley here for the night.
butchered a cow.

25 WEDNESDAY [56-309]

Very hot day. Mr and Mrs Thorne left. go back
to Cordoba. Mother went as far as C. de Gomez
with them. began to set up the wire netting.
Sent the men to the Independencia to fetch the horses
that got back there again.

Fixed a new capstan for the Typica. Mended, and discharged the old one, Ventura Jera.
 Saturated a cow.
 Mr. Nash here for the night.
 Mother came back from C. de Gomez.

27 FRIDAY [58-307]

Very hot day, north wind, clouds to the south.
 Sent cart to the station for 44 boxes of gink for the new hen house.
 Mr. Nash went around the poteros and left for the Raxango.
 Bought up some skulls and now from the guests.
 seen making wire netting.

28 SATURDAY [59-306]

Hare Hunting ends

Waked putting up the wire netting. it rained very heavy for an hour during the forenoon. Had the Miss Maustiches down to see Hernandez and back. a peon went along with them. Mrs. Botting's stop pool all afternoon here. The Nats called on in the afternoon.

1 Mar SUNDAY - 3 in Lent [60-305]

David, Abp.

Counted all the poteros 101 of D and 84 of B put them from 10.5 into 10.1 poteros.

Beautiful weather. fine cool nights.
began to dig the foundation for a new hen
house and galponito.

Received the ac. for the wheat sold to Batting's.

Very warm day. North wind.
 Herman and three carts went to Montes de Oca for bean. Johnnie went to Petacos. Two scores hauling bricks. Masons building. Butchered novillo in stack paddock. The two Halls came from ST to stay all night, also Kipley from Cañada de Gomez.

7 SATURDAY [66-299]

8 SUNDAY—4 in Lent [67-298]

Johnnie came back from to Pitcairn.
very hot day.

10 TUESDAY [69-296]

• 11° 51' A.M.

Bought Macintosh's sheep from him 211 head at 2.00
also paid him his share of last year wool 87.46
Macintosh goes to Poraro as mayordomo to Hall's place
at any sea. Mrs & Macintosh also went to Poraro.
Very hot day.

11 WEDNESDAY [70-295]

Very disagreeable weather. hot north wind.
Hall here. he sold his oxen to Dickman.
26 head at 40.00. Dickman took them away.
also sold him three of our own.
butchered a morillote.
Narrow and one man building.
three men making netted wire.
two men hauling buicks and two taking
down fence for new pig pasture.
Gustaf buying posts.

Cool day. but plenty of storm clouds hanging about. three men making wire netting, two helping masons in setting up fence. Anacleto took cart to Las Lomas brought home the well boring machine and primitive wool shears that Dickerson had borrowed. also four rams that Jehuac bought at twenty five rats apiece. Received the money for the three bullocks sold. Slaughtered a cow in the evening. getting an fell dry again. pastures very dry. Mercedes the copata of the Tijuar died last night. at the station of influenza. Jackson came over. asking subscriptions for the internal loan.

13 FRIDAY [73-295]

Strong north wind. storm clouds to the south. Slaughtered all the cattle at the Tijuar. and changed the Shaco novillia into No 1 paturo from No 3. Slaughtered a calf there. Bought up a paturo for Manuel's father Palatino to break in. Sent horse cart to the station to fetch a barrel of yerba and some boards.

14 SATURDAY [73-296]

Put the rams back into the sheep. five into set flock. 6 into pure flock and three into Shacita. Sent horse cart to San Jacinto to fetch some young steers. Paid to Popet Laminia of San 605. to our ac. Jehuac went to a dinner at the Hotel at station. Slaughtered a cow and a capon. South wind blowing ^{15 SUNDAY - 5 in Lent [74-297]} all day.

Cold disagreeable day. south winds struggling a little. hope it will rain more.

Sent three oxen in the morning and two in the afternoon.
to the station fetched 29½ posts bought from P. Samuere
at 2 pence.

Dickinson sent over for 120.88 joint installment to the bank.
Gustaf mending gates. cut gun alfalfa for the pigs.
Calisto stonaring.
Hired a new capataz to the Tijeras name Hippelli.

17 TUESDAY [76-891]

St. Patrick. 3^o 11^m A.M.

Saw the wind. cold drizzly day. men
fitting up netting and setting posts and
putting up fence on the lane.

Slaughtered a cow.

Gustaf looking after the gates.

Calisto stonaring.

Killed one of the old horses for the pigs.

18 WEDNESDAY [77-888]
