Beautiful weather. Sent Herman to Monte de Oca to enquire the price of appichilla.

Rans took down part of the old coffeehouse fence, and put in more posts and set up the new wire, repaired the rans, that must beek covering the cover. Mr Robinson was here over night, on his way to the Pajango.

Herman went to the station in the evening.

7 TUESDAY [97-268]

Easter Law Sittings begin

Warm day. sent Surtop to Monte de Oca to fetch appichilla brought 37 and 3 bags bean, appichilla at 5.50 & the 100 fl. Robinson was here over night. laid out fence in front of quinta and garden. began to plant posts, and take down old quinta fence. Satched a cow.

Herman and Mr Wendley went over to Las Rosas.

Hackwith from station has putting up the door and windows on the new rooms. the traps locked in over night.

8 WEDNESDAY [98-267]

9^h 57^m P.M.

Fine day. finished planting posts and began to get wire ready and bar posts holes. finished taking down old fence. Anacleto still sowing. finished the pie he has been working on. 20 ♡
dog killed two sheep at Tjeras. Herman killed the dog.

The greyhounds caught a deer a young buck in the old colony. brought it home alive.

Sent for three quintals of rice to Pajango.

Fire Insurance Days of Grace expire

Wet day. Peas all putting over on new quinta fence. made a bridge over the ditch on the new road. of 4. 2 inch boards and a lot of broken posts. covered it with earth.

Juste Sabatiana was here. sold him the Chaco morillas. 450 head at 30.00 apiece has until the end of June to take away in. is to pay for them as he takes made a boletta with him.

A sheep died at the Pignans potter.

Little Nellie died. (fox terrier)

Woke in a new horse to alfalfa seed.

Cylinder broke at the Tijeras.

10 FRIDAY [100-265]

Ramadan or Turkish Lent begins

Eastop mended cylinder at Tijeras.

Men finished the fence. marked out the holes for putting more posts on the east fence of the quinta and pony pasture. which is all to be taken down and made over.

Mother and Miss Hamilton and Donald drove to Sangre and back. Peas brought up Lina de vacas.

Changed the Chaco morillas from No 1 to No 3 Tijeras potter brought up from Mr. Walker 26 morillas and put them into the Pignans potter.

butchered a vacillonio. brought up a load of hay.

Secur a man to Obispo arrived.

Beautiful weather. Woke in a new horse to alfalfa seed.

11 SATURDAY [101-264]

Warm day. brought up the potter from the Tijeras. parted two into the stable and handled them.

Peas scattering posts, and boring nails. and cleaning up around the brick kilns.

Received a bundle of tanned wild animals skins.

12 SUNDAY - 2 aft Easter [102-263]

Cloudy day looks like rain. played pots at La Loma.

J. Sabatiana here parted 100 morillas paid on for them 4.500 shut in coal over night. paid blacksmiths as at station.

brought J. Withhall's spring machine 100 ft out cut for it.

gave Sabatiana a pole to recivador as how with.

It was a fine warm day. We are still at work at the fence around the quinta. We butchered a brace mervills, which left for German Gustaf and Ojeda and ~~the~~ Willers Garcia and Jose and Pantabeherrero worked half a day and all the rest work the whole day long Anacleto got the Alfalfa rowe out of order Gustaf mended it again.

14 TUESDAY [104-261]

It was a fine day it was warm weather. German went over to the station to see about some wire for the fence Garcia went with cart to the Rosar town. All hands hard at work at fence. This afternoon sent Garcia and Pantabeherrero to fix the stack fence and also bring a big load of hay. Cristobal Ramonero brought the cattle there 245 head in all. He bought a capon fence us. We put the stallions into the small potrero.

15 WEDNESDAY [105-260]

This morning it was very warm and cloudy. German and Carlitos brought up about forty horses out of the Alfalfa. They all belong to the town. Some shut them into the carrall and let the Comisario know he sent a solidor for them. Poems still at work at the fence. This afternoon the poems worked till three o'clock for it rained hard. We butchered a cow. The masons are working very slowly at the new house.

3¹ 10^m A.M.

This morning it rained hard.
 And the poens could not work. Mother and
 the servant girls worked a little in the garden.
 Herman took Maria with cart and got five quintals
 of wine and ten buckets.
 Atropo is stopping the night here.

17 FRIDAY [107-258]

This morning it is still cloudy and it is
 drizzling hard poens could not work at the fence.
 Therman went to the Tislar.
 Set Ojega and Orillers at work in the
 garden half a day.
 Atropo is stopping here the night.
 Therman is on well this evening.

18 SATURDAY [108-257]

It was cloudy but did not rain. We set the poens
 at fencing again. We butchered two calves.
 Anacleto sowed Alfalfa the hole day long.
 Gustaf went to the Tislar and mended the
 shute, brought up a big load of alfa.
 Andrez worked at the well in big pots.

19 SUNDAY—3 aft Easter [109-256]

It was a fine day. Ovelinor brother brought
 fifteen horses for us. He took Norman
 horse to the fivethyone. Therman went on
 a route to Bertingpa. Mother and Miss
 Marin took went out walking.

It was a little cloudy. Herman set poem to bring up some more Alfa.
 Herman and Arileno went to the station to get some more sand and kalk. We also got some more wire to finish the fence. We butchered to capons yesterday. Behavio worked half day. Garcia did not work. Anallita did not work. We butchered a vaillaona. Herman got two more boards to make some buckets. Sora and Loreto came. Mr Wash sent over for his reader

21 TUESDAY [111-254]

It was a foggy morning. Set Behavio and Joe at mending the fence on north side. Herman and Sora went over to station with Arileno with cart and got four big bags of flour. And four bags of sand and one of kalk. The Sargieran garido came on a visit a stoped the night here. Herman set poem at filling up around the berbeador by the poor house. Mother drove the ladies over to the Pinar town. Andres got finished with putting earth to the berbeador.

22 WEDNESDAY [112-253]

Holiday in Edinburgh, St. George, Latest
Day for Spring Quarter Sessions

John came back last night, was up in Santiago del Estero, bought
in Estacion Simbol F. Hall. 1506 guachos calados pulsed parts at 50 cents
put in wagon also 20 Moggos parts at 150 each and 20 long shaps at
150 and the leg for motor. Had 813.8 also ordered at the
same saw mill 10,000 parallels of guachos Hama 1 meter 40 cent meter
high by 5x7 centimeter thick at 25 cents each.

Paid, Eustakio Ramos for the 245 head cattle at rate P
2.695.8, changed pictures, manada white bits and Moggos.
Brought up the sheep from the Tijeras to disj tomorrow, mixed the disj.
Satched a cow, discharged the cook, hired another
person mending fences, sent cart to Piquito for yuba sugar turnips.
Took the 15 carobow horse **FRIDAY** [114-251] to the Tijeras No 3 Pasion.
Received 162 head of cattle from Bark D put them into No 2.
9:50 A.M.

Beautiful weather, dipped the sheep also the suns,
counted the sheep 1021 head.

persons finished mending with fence on colony side,
three men making wire netting out of No 13 wire for a garden
fence, three men planting the posts for garden fence,
masons whitewashing and putting mud floor into meat house,
hauled up a cart load of bricks.
Sona arrived from the 51 with his mares, shut them into corral.
Killed an old horse for the pigs and grease.

25 SATURDAY [115-250]
St. Mark, Evan.

Fine day, men finished making wire netting and putting
it up, finished the pasture, turned the articles into it.
Hauled up a load of hay, satched and old cow Remmes work.
Mares white washing, Sona still here with his mares.
Bohling's came over, bought his Tiedgen and children over.
Mr. Well child and son also mares arrived, stay on a visit.
traps shut in over **26 SUNDAY** - 4 aft Easter [116-249] night. Got a cow
from the Tubol.

Fine weather, like spring

Beautiful day. took up both gates of the fig canal and set one gate on the north side, and filled up the other gap with thin posts. cut a load of green alfalfa for the pigs. Slaughtered the cow that the trappers caught.

Whine played polo at La Lamer in the afternoon.

Nettie and Mrs. Watts drove over.

Started Coyote digging wells in new camp. pay him for wells 4 rows in diameter (around) 7.00 the row in depth and double that in the water, and 15.00 for putting in the board.

28 TUESDAY [118-247]

Cold morning nearly froze. Slaughtered up the heifers and marked the calves thirty one in all. left the twins entire and put them into the stock pens and separated the embryos to take to the Tjeras.

The heifer bull and one of the calves caught from Dickinson are sick. closed them both with black and red draught. Calisto and Cecile both handling the young horses. Took up the slack gate on the road to Simstony. Hauled bricks to the well that Coyote is digging.

29 WEDNESDAY [119-248]

Fine day. repaired all the bull calves among the new cattle at the Tjeras and caught 18 head up. and put them into the stock pens to sell. took 7 vacillas marked yesterday to the Tjeras to pasture to 4.

The Thorough Good Bull I died hauling bricks to the new wells. hauled up a load of hay. Mrs. Dickinson drove over in the afternoon. Donald came back from Rosario. The posts arrived at the station.

Beautiful weather. Sent three cuts to fetch the posts, from the station. paid the freight bill 21.40 \$ for each wagon for 7 wagon - 1496.80 \$ Sutchered an old or traded from a colonoit for a novilla, very fat. cut up its hide also the hide of the bull, and made two long pointed ropes for walls.

Sosa left, sent him 50.00 \$ on ac. of the interest on the money. also sent Pete Trumphet 50.00 \$ to help him out of difficulties. Sosa left two men and a pete here lame. took them to Sosa. Carts made two trips, getting up the posts, in the pasture. Calisto and Manuel and Lucio working with young hoes. Young St. Watt arrived, to take Mr Watt away to morrow.

1 May FRIDAY (191-244)
St. Philip and St. James, App. and M.
(1st 51st r.m.)

Mother went to Rosaris, shopping. Bought up the capons and Calabrera came and paid 250 and sent them to Rosaris. he pays 4.50 \$ apiece for them = 1260. \$.

Mr Watt went back to the San Andres.

Carts made two trips with posts. 6 loads 3 hundred posts. hauled more bricks to the mill.

Sent to San Lomas for certificate for capons.

counted the capons left. 134. dipped them. a young capon pig died.

2 SATURDAY (192-243)

Carts made two trips with posts, took up the pens of the sheep dip, to arrange them better.

one of the Rosa big rams died long disease. also a pig died in south pasture.

captured 34 young mackerel pigs.

Mr Galy called on in the afternoon.

3 Rogation SUNDAY (193-242)

Strong south wind cold. began to drizzle after sundown. Sutchered a cow.

Two rams fought cut each other a little.

5 TUESDAY [185-240]

Frost this morning. the first one this year.

carts made two trips with posts.

The sheep are lambing very fast.

marked out two new wells for Sogito to dig
Hauled up a load of dry hay.

Hennar drove to the station to meet Mr Hall but
he did not arrive.

Scattered a cow, Pons demaring.

Paid Peter his yearly salary.

sent horse cart to the station to fetch 2 bags sand one bag
lime. 4 one sack boards and the white work bushes.

Strong north wind all day, getting warmer again.

Carts made two trips, finished carting all the posts.

Ascension Day. Holy Thursday

Quite a warm day. parted out the sheep that we wanted to keep and sent the rest 450 heads belonging to Sabratina to the parents. to be left there until he sends for them.

Sutchred a cow and a sheep.

dug up one of the big silver mittles trees that the beasts killed.

Lusty blacksmithing.

sent to the Tigras for a load of lava de vaca.

Mr Schultz and another gentleman from the Germania were here for tea.

a sheep died in figurans potens.

8 FRIDAY [198-237]

● @ 10^o A.M.

Warm sultry day. Herman and four men went to the Tigras, and put posts (3) alongside of Sichen and burnt ones on the fence, and took a big post down and put it in place of one of the latched posts that was too short and always loose.

Dipped the sheep recently bought. 614 ewes and 11 capons. took the ewes to the Tigras and the sheep capons put among our own.

Mr Namuk and gente passed on the way to Bardshe to fetch cattle. a tripa looked in for the night.

9 SATURDAY [129-236]

Half Quarter Day

Carts (three or cats) hauled bricks to one of the new wells.

Sabratina sent for his sheep delivered to him 457 head.

At noon a very sudden storm came up and it rained and hailed awfully. the hail knocked all the twigs and boughs off of the trees and broke windows and destroyed all the vegetables.

the hail lay in great heaps all over the place until late

at night, Sutchred ^{a cow} ^{potens}

10 SUNDAY aft Ascension [130-235]

troopers broke into pig man's

Masons finished their work. paid them off.

Very cold morning. south wind all day.

Brought up the top of the stack in the pony paddock, it had blown off. put it into the stable.

Herman went to meet mother. but she telegraphed that she had missed the train.

It was a cold day. Johnie went into Rancho to get wire for fencing. Ouelito and Jose and Stepa and Ouelino are still casting bricks to the new wells. Chiverro did not work.

Panata worked half day.

Panta and Scilla brought up a big load of hay. Herman went over to station to meet Mother in big carriage.

Herman fixed the bucket in big poters
Butchered a cow.

12 TUESDAY [132-233]

This morning it was very cold and a heavy frost. Herman went to the Tinjarras to see how things were. And brought up two well ropes to mend the one in big potero. The carts got finished casting bricks. This afternoon Herman sent Surtaf with horse cart to the station the cook went a long.

We also sent Stepa and Jose with of cart to the station to get the fifty rolls wire that have arived.

Ouelino's brother came this evening to see the mules.

13 WEDNESDAY [133-232]

Old May Day

Johnie came back from Rancho this evening.

John Donald and Smaelite made out a log of holes for fencing a lane along the Texas fence, the road from Armstrong to Las Rosas station.

Poor fixing up carts and working about the place. brought up the potatoes from the Texas, and caught up the potato to home.

Satchered a cow.

Mr Ripley had breakfast here.

Sent carriage to the station to fetch M. Hall.

15 FRIDAY [135-230]

Easter Law Sittings end. Scotch Quarter Day.
Oxford Easter Term ends. 3 7-4 P.M.

Foggy morning. sent the three bullock carts to the station and brought over 1570 rails wooden, in three loads and in the afternoon three loads of lumber.

Sent Gustaf with cart and four horses to Montez de Oca bought 50 bags flour @ 6.00¢ the 100 R.

Sat a man at boring the rails & holes. bored 45 in the afternoon.

Mr Hall left for the S. Mr Ripley was here. received from him 100¢ for the two bags flour sold, minus 10¢ com.

Busebis digging just holes. pay him 3 cents the hole.

 cana and ration and biscuits. Herman took his bed along
 will sleep there. Took three or cart loads of parts down.

Beautiful day. Mr. Hall and nephew shot all fowls
sent down to Reinae by the 4 o'clock train.

All hands began again on the fence, sent a bullock
cart load of sawflies to the fence in the morning.

Sent two carts to the station in the afternoon, but
1 load of sawflies and 1 load of 50 pintals wine.
Sutchwood a bullock.

Sent horse cart to Armstrong to fetch Scher the carpenter,
it came back again in the evening.

Polittings came over in the evening.

26 TUESDAY [146-219]

Trinity Law Sittings begin

Cloudy misty day. All hands at fence.

Five boys finished digging holes on the lawn.

marked out holes for the division fence through the
new apple pasture, east and west, nearly thirty square.

Two carts went to the station, but one wine and 1 barrel tar.

Sent up a load of hay, and took a load of sawflies
with horse cart to the fence.

Scher the carpenter began work making tables.
pay him 50.00 \$ per month

Painter painting upstairs and putting in window panes.

Sutchwood a capon.

27 WEDNESDAY [147-318]

Cloudy misty day. Sent a cart load of sawflies, and
another of potato to the fence.

got a load of lena de vaca from the Topias.

Took the after off of two or carts, straightened them.

Joe bring sawflies all day.

Mother and Miss Macintosh drove to the fence and
to the station.

went carriage to Baker for Galletas.

Mr. Watt and son had breakfast here.

Cloudy, wet forenoon. One ewe died in south potrero. It was skinned and the meat brought up for the pigs. One mala cara horse butchered for the pigs. Two animals butchered. Jose and Seja bored varillas all day. Donald drove Mr. Johnnie to the station. He is going to Buenos Aires to play polo.

29 FRIDAY [149-216]

Cold damp day. Herman removed his tent farther along the fence. In the morning two carts went to the station for varillas, and in the afternoon three cart loads were brought over. No varillas were bored to-day. One ram cleared out, and was brought back in the afternoon. It was with the sheep in the south potrero.

30 SATURDAY [150-215]

C 0° 55° P.M.

Wet foggy morning. The carts were unloaded and then Jose and Seja bored varillas the rest of the day. Avelino and Panta took an ox-cart load of varillas down to the fencers, and in the afternoon filled up the varillas. The cook left to-day. Gustaf drove him to the town, and brought back two bags of stone coal, one barrel yerba, a demijuan of cana, one box groceries, 2 cans paint, and one bag of galletas.

31 SUNDAY—1 aft. Trin [215-214]

Fine day. Herman came up last night, and went back this afternoon. Butchered a cow this morning. Mrs. Benita and Miss Macintosh drove out to the colonists in the big carriage.

Fine day. Butchered two cows in the morning. José and Seja bored varillas all day. Avelino and Panta brought up a cart load of hay. In the afternoon Avelino took ten quintales of wire down to the fences, and Panta mended a broken fence. Donald brought a parcel from the station.

2 TUESDAY [183-213]

Warm day. Avelino and Panta took meat and biscuits to the fences and brought back green alfalfa for the pigs, and then hauled brush to the peon house.

Balistro, Cecillo and José Montoya went to the Tijeras and parted out twenty cows and put them in the horse potreros. Seja bored varillas all day and José half a day.

Avelino and Panta loaded up their carts with posts and then sawed wood the rest of the day.

Donald took a demijuan of caña to Herman and then drove to the station for the mail and biscuits. A tropa was locked up in the big coral over night.

3 WEDNESDAY [184-214]

Warm day, south wind. Avelino and Panta took two ox cart loads of posts to the fences, and then sawed wood the rest of the day.

Butchered a cow this morning. Seja went in the cart, and when he came back bored varillas with José. One borega died in pig man's potrero. Sent a telegram to C. Kiebsa hermanos for varnish and wrote for two dozen bits (screw). Received from Salvatierra's capatas the sum of three thousand and ninety dollars.

A tropa locked in over night.

Beautiful day. Salvatierra's capatas took one hundred and eight novillos away this morning from the south potrero. Panta mended fences, and Avelino worked in the quinta. Seja and Jose' bored varillas. Seja, in the morning, brought up two sheep from the pig man's potrero for the pigs. Butchered two cows.

5 FRIDAY (156-209)

Johnnie came back from P.A. checked the Potrero at pots all brands making at fence. sent two cart loads of material to the fence. cut a load of green alfalfa for the pigs. a novillo died at the tejeras, also two ones. Carpenter busy making bedslats. Joe boring rivets.

6 SATURDAY (157-208)

● 4° 20° P.M.

Cloudy day, hot warm. Johnnie drove to the station to meet Mrs. Jones but she did not arrive. sent horse cart to the fence with torisquitos. brought up the broken chairs from the tejeras got up a load of alfalfa hay. Paid railroad freight bills.

7 SUNDAY - 2 aft Trin (158-207)

Began to rain in the morning, and rained steadily all day, but not cold, east winds. Norman drove to the station in the morning, and brought back two bull terrier pups. M. J. Hall put out of commission. Butchered two varillas in the morning.

9 TUESDAY [160-205]

10 WEDNESDAY [161-204]

Finished the lower of the lanes (one league). moved
 the tent, and took to the next line of fanning to do.
 Sabatena sent gente to put novillia took 99 now 3 for
 the Tijeras, shot in our night.
 Sent three loads of stuff (furs) to the new line of fanning.
 Slaughtered 2 small animals.
 Brought over 3 cart loads of algaroba beans from the
 station.
 Very damp weather.

St. Barnabas, Ap.

Warm foggy misty day. Heuman began to set posts and pull wire with his gentie.

sent four cart loads of material to the fences.

Paid for the algebra beans 23 bags — @ 118 the 10k. = \$ 272.00
Calisto got a bad kick in the face from a mare.

Made Sebastian certificate for the 199 novilleros E. (made at Los Rios)

His men took away 18 nov H the last ones but one left back as sick. they also took away 3 old bullock out of jug man patches. left here tired they last time they passed down.

12 FRIDAY [163-203]

Cloudy, salty weather. Sutchend 2 capons and 2 vacillas, carpenter working on the tubidas.

Sent to blacksmithing, an Italian poor cutting bolts.

Heuman men fencing all day.

1 poor cutting wire for tying on vacillas.

2 ox carts scattering posts and vacillas all day.

A cow of Mr. Markes (D) died at the Tijeras.

13 SATURDAY [164-203]

Cloudy day again, but warmer. Joseline met Mrs. James and two children and governor at station they come on a visit.

Took two bundle gates, and set them up on the new fence.

14 SUNDAY — 3 aft Trin [165-200]

3³⁰ P.M.

Cleared up at last, harrah! skin show all day.

Boottings came over in the afternoon.

Save the capacity of the Tijeras four more horses for the work there.

Foggy in the morning. but cleared up into a fine day with wind.

All hands again at the fence. hauled the new pens. from the fencing pens set ^{the} day. got gallop and a lot. Sent three carts made two trips from station with varillas. Marked out thirty square of pot holes along the west side of R.R. line. Finished digging holes.

Butchered two small animals.

Joe McGuire was here in the afternoon.

Sent horse cart to the station for the cook who came back again. Joe being varillas all day.

16 TUESDAY [187-188]

Fine sunny day, but big heavy clouds hanging about. Mr. R. Dix the Reno R.R. government inspector came out and while he was here in the evening. he comes to make enquiries about the fencing of the R.R. through our land. he went away again in the afternoon.

Sent some varillas to the fence in the horse cart.

The ladies drove out in the afternoon.

Killed an old horse. (pained chair) for the pigs.

Paid the freight on the last load of varillas \$150.50

17 WEDNESDAY [188-187]

Beautiful day, sunny. but heavy clouds hanging about. Brought up the potter from the Tynas. caught up one for Soclo to turn. and one to give to Adella Lawrence. Cutting along pretty fast with the fence. changed the encampment.

Butchered two animals.

Sent three of carts to the station for wood. a wagon had arrived for us from Holsten in Canada.

Mother and ladies drove to the Tynas.

Mr. Norman shall here for the night.

Joe being varillas every day.

Rained quite hard last night. Thundered a lot, but cleared up fine in the morning, and was a fine sunny day.
 Set up a gate opposite the gate going into the Tijeras camp. on the base.
 Bittling sent over a cart with 4 bags of maize for us, and took away 130 ramitas sold to him at 35 cents. — 45.50
 also 4 bags of alfalfa seed weighing 601 lb @ 5.00 to 10K.

19 FRIDAY (170-195)

Cleared up and got very cold last night. Sleet in the morning it clouded up and rained a little nearly all day.
 finished the division fence, scattered three or four loads of posts along the line along the R.R.
 Butchered two animals, and a sucking pig.
 Sent horse cart to the station for galloper, cana, and an encomienda.
 a sheep died in south pasture No. 1 flock.

20 SATURDAY (171-194)

Accession of Queen Victoria, 1837

Cleared up last night, with a strong south wind very cold day. Moved the tent to the south end of line along the R.R. and reared and mended up the whole of the old south fence 20 squares and made one square near the line entirely new, putting in snow posts.
 Foot ball match a Las Lunas, all our folks attended except Johnie and ^{Rev. Macintosh.}

21 SUNDAY — 4 aft Trin (173-193)

Summer commences 12^h (noon)

Beautiful day. Snow hard in the morning.
 Mother and Mrs. James drove to La. Rosas.
 Johnie played polo at Las Lunas.
 dogs killed two sheep last night.
 Slaughtered two animals.

O 5° 12' A.M.

Cold morning, but beautiful day.
 Herman and all his men began on the fence
 along the R.R. fifteen men.
 Mr. James left in the afternoon.
 Hauled potatoes and turnips and legs of hogs, in
 two bullock carts, to the north well in the new potatoes.
 Sent some hogs to rest, in No 3 potato at the Sigmas.

23 TUESDAY [174-191]

Fine day, nice and sunny. Hauled two ox cart loads with
 6 hogs to the well in the forenoon, and one with 8 in the
 afternoon, and one load of posts scattered along the line.
 Changed the encampment. took rails down in horse cart,
 hatched two animals.
 Adley looked in a trap over night, enticed him his potato.

24 WEDNESDAY [176-190]

St. John Baptist, Midsummer Day,
 Quarter Day, Cambridge Easter Term ends

Beautiful day. Hauled two cart loads of posts to
 the fence, and two horse cart loads of rails.
 Got up turned hogs and potato at new well.
 brought up a load of dry alfalfa, and a load of
 green alfalfa for the pigs.
 Packed off animals at the Sigmas, for hatching,
 put them into the horse potato.
 Donald drove to the station and brought home Mrs. Connie
 and two children.
 Josie rode to Cold Spring and back, had a solicitor
 written out by a notary, to send to the Minister of the Interior
 to oblige the R.R. for the fencing.

North wind, getting warm again.

Herman getting along fast with the fence now.

Hauled down two cart loads of posts, and one of wire and turniquets, and hauled two trips of varillas with horse cart. two men bring varillas. Elected to mend the fobida's again. Laid out the land with single plough for ploughing in the new quinta. Slaughtered two animals.

Mr Dickson here for tea. Mr Smith, Mr Hainich and Maggie went out riding in the evening.

Received receipt from Santiago for the varilla chique sent 2,150 \$ sent a letter for two wagons more of posts.

26 FRIDAY [177-188]

North wind, but cool.

Set up a hurdle gate with lock, in the Two Laguna corner.

Killed an old mare for the pigs.

dog killed a lamb and a ewe in the big pastures.

Horse cart scattering varillas, as fast as the men could see them.

finished marking out the holes along the line as far as the end of the camp, and then marked out on the east side of rails, and south side of little paddock.

Carpenter putting together another set of siberlar.

Ladies went out riding in the evening.

27 SATURDAY [178-187]

North wind, getting warmer. Mr Johnson here for the night.

One or cart made three trips scattering posts along the line.

also hauled turniquets and wire there.

Slaughtered two animals. Got up a load of dry alfalfa.

began to cut off of the stock back of the galpon.

Mr White came out by the morning train but went back again in the evening, also

28 SUNDAY - 5 alt Trin [179-186]
Coronation of Queen Victoria, 1838.
(11^h 16^m P.M.)

Strong north wind, quite warm, played polo at San Lomas.

St. Peter, Apos.

Very clear warm day, cloudy. All hands began at the fence again. Hauling down rails and wire. Two men boring rails.

Donald and a few went to Los Hornos looked through their south flock of sheep. But did not find any of our "stragglers" two animals.

A. took of 2000 head of cattle very thirsty. gave water to them at pig manure potato well. in stack potato well, and south potato well. and dried up all the wells. but gave water enough. so would in the camp tonight.

Sent Salisto to the bank with solicited. to get signatures.

30 TUESDAY [1891-1891]

Quarter Sessions Week

Wind changed. and in the afternoon it rained hard from the south. could not work.

troop passed by. on the way north.

Johnnie took message of troop to the Rear.

Mr. Hall here for breakfast.

Special train passed with Mr. Fisher and the being the man that is to take Mr. Fisher's place as manager.

1 July WEDNESDAY [1892-1893]

Clear up nicely last night. but it was a nasty foggy cold morning. fences began to fence on the east side of the R.R. from Kemmer's fence this way. hauled down posts with horse cart.

Two men boring rails.
