 the fence of pasture east side of rails. also finished planting posts.
 Brought up the No 1 flock of sheep out of the south pasture, and
 scoured the lambs one hundred and ten, and parted four
 expositors out, also hand cored the ramms.

Miss M. Macintosh went to Rosario.

1 sheep died No 1 flock.

4 SATURDAY [185-180]

Declaration of American Independence

Put up the flag. very raw chilly day.

Finished the fence of the pasture east side of rails. put up
 gate going into little pasture, also gate at the crossing of the R.R.
 Switched two animals.

Brought up a load of hay, took four behidas to the road
 with in the five hundred square pasture.

5 SUNDAY—6 aft Trin [186-179]

Dividends due at Bank

Very cold cloudy raw disagreeable day.
 Johnie played foot at Las Lunas.

Old Midsummer Day. ● 9° 50' A.M.

Cloudy misty day. Moved the tent to this side of the R.R. opposite the horse pasture fence. all hands began to take it down marked out foot holes. Busch's digging holes.

Started to plow with double plow in the new quarts. with skulls.

Butchered two animals.

Joe being varillas.

Carpenter putting together another pileta.

7 TUESDAY [188-177]

Very misty day. damp. Hermon fences began to put up fence on north side of horse pasture, extension to the rails. scattered material with ox cart in the morning and in the afternoon with horse cart.

ploughed all day.

Seja takes care of pigs brings up two loads of grass apples every day for them.

Brought up the sheep, ^{40 1/2 flock} penclaud 318 lambs and cleaned tails and cut hoofs.

8 WEDNESDAY [189-176]

Very close foggy all day, marked out holes, ^{east} side of R.R. fences began to south fence of extension of horse pasture to the R.R.

Fire Insurance Days of Grace expire

75th anniversary of the Independence of the glorious Argentine Republic. ~~Swedish~~! seems only worked half a day, just the more mess on the east fence of south pasture, making over wire, to keep the sheep out of Raymond's wheat. Sutchard two animals. Very damp misty weather.

10 FRIDAY [191-174]

Wind sprang up from the south, rained hard during the forenoon and in the evening lobs like clearing up. Carpenter making a cylinder, Gustaf mending shovels.

11 SATURDAY [192-173]

Oxford Trinity Term ends

Very cold this morning, strong south wind all day. Herman and his men repairing old fences. Anacleto digging holes to transplant pines near sheep dip. Glose cart scattered two loads of manure, along line to fence. Sutchard two capons, sent one to station master, front. Sutchard 6 fat pigs, sent horse cart to station for groceries.

12 SUNDAY—7 aft Trin [193-172]

Received from Sabatena, 3,502.50⁰⁰ or ^{or} single of swiss made sheep capons and lot of 99 millin. Beautiful sunny day, heavy frost in the morning, out up and packed down the six pigs killed yesterday. Sutchard two animals. Johnie played polo yesterday at Los Hornos.

Frost this morning, but foggy until noon.
Mr. Nash came. Sent him three ponies, he parted
out 15 of his cows at the Tijera, put them into
the pigman's pasture, they are for Mr. James.

Nash staid all night.
Sent 4 jilotes to the mill in 500 square pastures.
Herman with horse cart and four men took mine
and two jilotes to the Tijera and pulled two more
wires on one league of fencing, on the N. and W. side
of the 4 pastures to keep the sheep in.
Brought a potrancia $\text{\$}$ from Tijera camp.
Hauling bricks to the new pasture.

14 TUESDAY [1895-1896]

9^h 29^m A.M.

Very heavy frost this morning. Mr. Nash left.
gave him a fat capon. Sent him 100. $\text{\$}$
brought up the capon. cleaned their tracks.
One wagon full of wood 235 brought three loads
over, scattered them along the line of holes.
Men still at work at the Tijera, joining more wires.
Sent horse cart to the Independencia, brought up
the meat of a tonno of ours we had butchered
there.
Paid Pequet Lemunire on their ac. 1,000. $\text{\$}$

15 WEDNESDAY [1896-1897]

St. Swithun's Day

Very cold day, north wind. ox carts brought three
more loads of posts, scattered two, along the line
of division fence. scattered vanilla also.
Fencers began fence along the mill.
Miss Macintosh came back from Rosario.

North wing, very damp weather, cloudy, foggy.

Mason began on the posts at the gate of the R.R. crossing.

Pearl packed out 25 cows at the Tigris, at the same time packed out all the calves 34 out of 4 cows, and put them with the ones into the horse pastures.

Butchered a cow.

All hands at the fence, did a good bit.

sent horse cart to the station, for herbs and sugar.

collected two capons, gave me the some passing surveys.

17 FRIDAY [198-167]

Very warm sultry day, north winds, hot but like more rain.

Fences finished fence along the rails, began extension of south fence of horse pastures, to the rails.

butchered two animals.

We took sent two men to take away the 15 cows 4 packed.

brought up a load of dry alfalfa.

Mason working at fence posts.

a sheep died lambing.

18 SATURDAY [199-166]

Wind, changed to the south, and it was a beautiful

day, changed the 26 cows 4 from pig man pastures to

the south pastures, and brought up the hedges and railles 4

72 from the Tigris 104 and also put them into the south pastures.

Finished the fencing this side of line, and after clearing up

all the old wire posts and railles moved the tent, to

the new line of fence. 19. SUNDAY - 8 aft Trin [200-165] dinner in the new pastures

Some day, Commission from town were here, collecting

money for the church, subscribed a hundred mats.

played polo at Los Lunas.

Began on the fence to leave long division running N. and S. through the south 6 bounded square pasture. it goes by the well. same well will do for both. Brought up the pasture. Valentin begins to tame caught up two for him, one for Borealis and one for Calistis.

Butchered two animals.

Finished breaking up the lands in new quarts. and began on the one on the other side of corral.

Very close cloudy day. looks like rain.

Put the pasture with the south pasture. will put the mare down to the No 4 Pasture Tigers.

21 TUESDAY [302-163]

0¹ 54² P.M.

Beautiful morning. but at noon the wind changed to the south and it began to rain and get cold.

Fencer could not fence as the posts were short.

Johnie and Guitto took the fencing posts and began to set up pickets and besides until weather stopped them. Sent Manuel to the Argentinia to remove the cattle that are a going to be taken off the camp.

Pedro Toledo the former captives of the Argentinia brought his cattle here to sell, 95 head put them into No 4 Pasture, did not arrange price yet.

Washed pens about in some stables, in corral.

22 WEDNESDAY [303-162]

Terrible tempest, strong south wind raining hard all last night and all day. tore the tent from all wet and miserable.

Pigs suffering from the cold. could do no work except in the shop.

South wind, but beautiful day, very cold night. rained hard a lot of little lambs died, also young pigs.

Too wet to do any work.

Joe bring oxen.

Johnie arranged accounts with Bottlings.
Butchered two oxen.

24 FRIDAY [205-160]

Beautiful day. Herman took men to the Tines and finished pulling the two series around the 26th posts.

Two of carts brought from station with and wood for fence and other wood iron and nails to the house.

In the afternoon, ox cart took logs for sleds, cylinder and other runways to the well in 500 square posts.

Pedro Toledo was here, paid him for the 95 head of cattle at 5.00 each 475.00. I gave us certificate, mark 5.

Archie breaking up camp on other side of canal.

Mason working on fence.

paid freight bill 14.00

25 SATURDAY [206-159]

St. James, Apos.

Fine day. Johnie Gustaf and fencing men set up the sleds and finished them. also set up a gate near the well on the division fence.

Mason working on the fence, ox cart hauling bricks to the fence.

Butchered two oxen.

Posts arrived at station.

Sent a cheque to Bottlings ^{28 SUNDAY [207-158]} for a wagon for the oxen for Dickson 625.00 300 posts Bottlings 270.00 and 485 posts for us — 242.50 — \$1137.50

28 TUESDAY [189-156]
 (4^h 39^m A.M.)

29 WEDNESDAY [189-155]

Johnnie came back from Ponia, paid all the bills owing there. with purchases and expenses paid out. $\$1107.31$ ² Caught another double plough.

Fences finished the division fence. began to work fence around the mill.

Lustaf tanning all day.

Mason working on the posts.

Took one of cat loads of nails to the fence on the morning. In the afternoon brought 2 loads last ones of posts from the station.

Brought up the potato. caught three more to come.

Johnie, Gustaf and fencing peons, made fence around well
and put up uprights and cylinders at wells of the two south portions.
finished tanning everything.

Butchered into animals.

Peon demanding. Arelius smearing.

Smalla peck.

31 FRIDAY [212-153]

Put up part of fence, and uprights and cylinders at
wells in two square portions. Tanned everything.
Carted bricks to press in bullock cart.

Themor went to the station in carriage, got two
demijohns wine and stuff for parties for the dance
tomorrow night.

Syrita finished mucking at the wells.

Andratta and one peon filling in almost wells.
one peon sawing off tops of fence posts.

1 Aug SATURDAY [213-152]

Lammas Day, Scotch Quarter Day

Foggy morning, finished the wells, put up paper and bucket
and finished the fence.

Mother came back. M. S. Hall came with her.

Scotch Equina bought 305 heads of cattle all sent to summer,
put them into portion No. 6. at 75^{cts} a head.

Butchered a cow, can curio, for the sale tonight.

2 SUNDAY—10 aft Trin [214-151]

Beautiful day. Discharged, paid off, all the fencing
peons. peons danced all night.

Equina had all the bulls castrated in his cattle.

Johnie played polo at Los Lomas.

Lammas Monday, Bank Holiday. Royal Academy closes.

Beautiful day. drew water for the first time in the two wells finished. Draught up the cows & out of No 2 potter and put them into the new potter No 7. Mason still working at the piers.

4 TUESDAY [216-149]

● 5^h 12^m P.M.

Frosty morning. skinned one of Seaguer's animals in No 6 potter.

Butchered two animals.

Brought up the manada (short hester) out of the stack potter put it into new No 6. put the work horse into new No 5. and plow horse into those potter.

Went out to station for a double plough and boards from Rowan. in the afternoon hauled pile and two sleds to the new well in new No 8 potter.

dog killed a sheep in No 1 flock.

5 WEDNESDAY [217-148]

Very heavy frost this morning. white as snow. put the wood for the night on the piers. hauled a load of bricks to the piers and two into the back yard.

Carted turned the pile and sleds.

took the calves & from the house potter into the pig manor potter.

North wind but very cold in the morning.
 Johnie and peon laying off summer for ploughing.
 Bought up all the guano animals from the puerto
 parted out Solomon's manure and the goods of the old
 manure and put them into No. 7 potter.
 and the old manure into the horse potter.
 and the rest of the animals back to the puerto.
 Received news from Lanka. W. H. Fox engaged to Miss A. Macintosh.

7 FRIDAY [219-148]
 Mohammedan Year 1309 begins

North wind, getting warm again.
 Gustaf and mason putting brick on puerto roof.
 Nithe and Herman went to the station shopping.
 Mr. Nick and a gentleman here for breakfast.
 Slaughtered two animals.
 a sheep and No. 1 flock.
 Panta ploughing.
 three peons digging holes to plant trees.
 Cecilio and Valentin went off to galop their potter.

8 SATURDAY [220-149]

North wind, quite warm day.
 Bought up all the guano animals from the Tupper from No. 1 potter.
 parted out all No. 98 and put them into No. 5. and our
 own 84 put into No. 6 and the manure from No. 6 put into
 No. 7. Johnie went to La. Peon; paid 200.00 freight bill.

9 SUNDAY—11 aft Trin [221-149]

Paid the baker bill 193.50
 Strong south wind.
 R. Macintosh rode up from S. de San José.
 Johnie and Macintosh played golf at La. Loma.

Beautiful day. started the other double plough.
 Both ploughs breaking up camp in the house pasture.
 Maunick left again for "eroga pen"
 Satchwood two animals.
 Joseph and Manuel went to the 51 to help take W. Hells
 million to the "eroga pen".
 Laid out a pole ground in house pasture for a match
 to be played on Saturday.
 Sent horse cart to station for lime and sand.
 Brought up the piston, caught up three to time.

11 TUESDAY [1891-1892]
 Half Quarter Day. Dog Days end

North wind, fine day. Mr. W. Hells here for breakfast.
 Mr. Nash sent 92 cows all with calves put them into
 big new pasture N. 5.
 Brought up the capons to the one.
 Ceceli and Valentin still observing.

12 WEDNESDAY [1891-1892]
 Grouse Shooting begins. Trinity Law Sittings
 end. 9^h 12^m P.M.

Beautiful day. Carpenter making box for horse cart.
 Carthy making buckets.
 George moving with machine, pole ground.
 Two ploughs working. Horse still busy on pasture.
 Spracklet finished, filling up colanets wells.
 Two men digging holes for planting trees.
 Mother and Miss Mayory drove over to Bonthingbos.
 Olga still tends to the pigs, cuts two loads of turg
 quatch every day for pig.
 Yennan mending roof

Old Lamas Day

Warm day, north wind keeps like rain.
 Brought up 19 animals to butcher, from the Tijeras.
 Worked all day setting up binders, jilts and cylinders at well
 in the small new pasture lot.
 Butchered a novillito, and a capon.
 Finished moving the job ground.
 Slogged all the parasit trees and had on the roof drying.

14 FRIDAY [1326-133]

Warm sultry day. Big clouds about.
 Finished putting up the machinery and fence
 around the well.
 Miss Macintosh drove to the station, shopping.
 Sent to the pulperia for wallow boards for making
 steps.
 A troop of novillos from the 51 lock in over night.

15 SATURDAY [1327-138]

Rained very hard nearly all night, cañadas full
 of water. could not do any work, except in the shop.
 killed a capon.

16 SUNDAY—12 aft Trin [1328-137]

Rained all last night, and nearly all day.
 butchered a novilla and a capon.

Rained nearly all last night and all day,
cloudy weather.

Could only work in the shop.

Santa Barbara here in the afternoon.

18 TUESDAY [1890-1891]

Raining hard yet cloudy weather, wind changed
to the south.

Switched a cow.

19 WEDNESDAY [1891-1891]

9²⁵ P.M.

Clears up at last, fine day, south wind.

Trought up a load of dry alfalfa.

Wagon painting with lime, the points.

Not think here for breakfast.

P. Buffie had both of his sons killed yesterday
by their horses falling down on them.

A colovint from Ester Rin came, with a note
from William for 300. I paid it.

Substina from here, to get to woman.

Black Game Shooting begins

Beautiful day. Sabatiana came, parted out 58 mer. lin from the Tycor and also 20 ayare caloca sold to him @ 8.00 sent to San Lomas for certificate, he paid us 570.00 on ac. Mr Dickinson baby and nurse came over to stay for a few days, A. Dickinson came over in the afternoon. Butchered a cow.

Cleaned out the colonist well near the new puente. Judy the young bull bitch, got at some grass and died. Killed two old maas for the pigs. Discharged washerman began to plough again. got Doña Rosa for washwoman. Old Anton the gardener very sick. Bought 15 bags of potatoes @ 1.30 the 100.

21 FRIDAY [133-134]

Fine day. Sabatiana left.

Herman went to the shade to stay awhile with Alfred he took 150.00 along.

Took manada from No 2 pasture to No 1.

Butchered a young cow

a paper seed, jeans digging out parais trees in quinta and planting them between sheep slips and corral.

People say lots of locusts are coming down from the north.

22 SATURDAY [134-135]

Nice day. parted out 31 vacillos & our share of the 75 cabon taken this year ago on halves. put them into pasture pastures.

Mr Divisor was here. parted out 100 animals from No 7. into No 5.

Sanguina arrived with more cattle to summer.

23 SUNDAY—13 aft Trin [135-136]

Beautiful weather. Received 200 head of cattle at corte from Sanguina. put 199 into No 3 and 1 into No 6. (billed)

A. Dickinson came after Mr D. Bunting's horse for tea. Butchered two animals. Met Whisk breakfast here. Johnie played polo at San Lomas.

St. Bartholomew, Ap.

Received a tripella of horses from Helms, turned by him.
 Besebi mending fences. Party and carpenter mending
 shellack carts. Besebi, Galan, and Calisto donning
 brought up the petranos from the caught two for
 madras. one plough working.

25 TUESDAY [1891-1892]

Cloudy misty day. looks like rain.
 Miss Eric Mabitth came out on a visit.
 Slaughtered two animals.
 sent horse cart to the station for flour from Beccanua
 a sheep died in Jigman's pasture.

started peon to dig holes for trees, but could not work much.

Received telegram, William coming tomorrow.

30 SUNDAY - 14 aft Trin [194-195]

Cloudy all day. William and family arrived.

Butchered a capon.

Sent telegram to William to expect us on the 31st.

Put William and family in the house.

Very wet all forenoon, but cleared up in the afternoon, and the sun came out. The carriage went to meet M^{rs} Benitz, but she did not come. Anacleto and Chevero went to Sejiras to transplant trees. Donald drove M^{rs} Johnnie and M^{rs} William to the station in the afternoon. They are going to the Chaco. Butchered two animals. Tropa shut up all night in the big coral. Panta and Capiango did not work to-day.

1 Sept TUESDAY [1891-1892]

Partridge shooting begins. Order Letta's Diary for next year.

Cold morning, but got warm in the afternoon. Gustaf brought five bags of sand and an axil from the station. M^{rs} Benitz arrived from Rosario and brought a cook and servant-girl. In the afternoon the cart went to Sejiras and carted trees from the monte to the house. Capiango worked half a day. Panta has not come yet.

2 WEDNESDAY [1891-1892]

Warm day. The horse-cart took eighteen trees from Sejiras to Pilars. In the afternoon the cart took the new servant-girl to the station, and brought back four bags of coal, one bag maize, three pots of paint, and some small plants, and then went brought twenty-nine post heads from the fence. Chevero did not work to-day. Valentin came back to-day. Butchered a capon. Two sheep killed by dogs in South potrero. One was skinned and brought up. The other was half eaten. Jose Rengo caught up two potros.

● 8^h 10^m A.M.

Hasty cloudy day. Threatened to rain. Butchered two animals. One sheep died in South potrero, and another in Big man's potrero. Both were skinned and given to pigs.

The horse cart brought up two hundred and twenty seven post heads. Mr^r Hamilton from San Andres stayed here last night. Mr^s Dickinson and two ladies were here to tea. Salvatierra is here to-night and his plane. Chevelo did not work to-day.

Salvatierra paid 1.100.0 on a cow cattle bought.

4 FRIDAY [347-118]

Cold morning, but very warm afternoon. Salvatierra parted ninety head of cattle from number one potrero, and took them away. The cart brought thirty post heads up. Avelino did not work to-day.

5 SATURDAY [348-117]

Very warm day. Donald drove to the station to meet a seamstress, but she did not arrive, and brought a demijuan of caña. The cart went over too, for a barrel of yerba and galletas. Butchered a capon. One sheep died in South potrero.

Anacleto washed the big carriage. Seventeen post heads brought up.

6 SUNDAY—15 alt. Trin [349-116]

Very cold morning. South wind. It got a little warmer in the afternoon. Butchered one animal. All the Bothlings were here for tea. Lasso is staying here. He came yesterday.

Carpenter went to Armstrongs

Very cold morning. Hard frost last night. One sheep killed by dogs in South potrero. It was skinned and given to pigs. Anacleto and Capiango and Jose Montoya did not work to-day.

8 TUESDAY [951-114]

Cold cloudy day. Two sheep died in pig man's potrero and one in South potrero. They were skinned and given to the pigs. The cart brought up sixty-five post-heads. The seamstress arrived to-day. Butchered one animal. Avelin and Jose Montoya did not work to-day. Mr^r Robinson from Cañada de Gomez was here for breakfast. The three Misses Macintosh and Mr^s Clara's children drove to the Lomas to see a polo match.

9 WEDNESDAY [952-113]

Beautiful weather. cool in the morning. Wall's and John's came back from the States, a servant girl from Brazil came along. Bought a lot of skins and currier along. Goods came cart to the station for the baggage. Bought up a granadero from Tijuca to mark fields. put potrero from south into No 6 potrero, and potreros for No 6 into south potrero. Paid Sosa interest on the \$5000 @ 7/11. Had paid him 500 before, from Sept 5/91 to Sept 5/91.

Brought up all the four manoadas and parted out all the goats' embers separate from the machos; marked the embers 69 and put them into the south pasture, and the machos 73 and 2 embers into the No 8 pasture.
Saw 2 goats.

Butchered a cow at the Tijeras.

Curbed morning off the ~~stiff~~ polo ground.

Brought up the flock of sheep to feed off the polo ground.

11 FRIDAY [854-111]

11-7th A.M.

North wind, getting warm again.

Brought up all the manoadas again and remake them put in 27 potencias into the different manoadas and culled out 27 old maas and put them into Polares pasture.

Butchered a capon.

Miss A. and J. Moran took both went to Rancho.

Jennie and William went and called on Rancho.

Sent horse cart to Las Rosas brought over a new harrow and a hundred Terrigants.
