Began to show, clipped the rams 22 before breakfast and  
clipped part of No 2 in the afternoon. parted out all the buyers  
and have got them on further reports. also parted 38 capons  
put them among the other capons. eight were slipping.  
butchered two animals. a yearling felly died.

Mrs. Watt and son Mr. C.P. and Latham Hall and Mr. Ripley here  
for the night.

## 18 SUNDAY—21 aft Trin [891-74]

Rained very hard last night. strong north wind.

very muddy. Mrs. Watt and her son left for St. Peter's

Mr. Ripley left for St. Peter's. Cuello went with him.

Bright sunny day. Mr C.P. and L. M. left for the 5<sup>th</sup>.  
Finished No 2 flock at noon, brought up No 3 and began  
to clip them. parted out of No 3 all the ewes and  
162 capons just then arriving other capons.

Joe McGuire parted out 111 head of his own cattle.  
paid 250.00 inwards ac.

Mr Nash and Davidson here for breakfast.  
received from Mr Nash a cheque on London bank for 2,000.  
on ac of the inwards.

Carpenter and Mason finished their work.

Three tramps here for the night.

Mr W. which had breakfast here.

## 20 TUESDAY [293-72]

Fine day, beautiful weather.

a ewe lamb drowned in dip last night.

one sheep died No 2 flock. Dipped No 2 flock  
and took back to Texas. Finished No 3 and began  
on No 1. beautiful clear wool. no scab at all.

Paid off the carpenter 187.00 also the mason 13.40  
Sent them to Drurytown in horse cart. cart came back  
again in the evening.

Another tramp staying the night.

## 21 WEDNESDAY [294-71]

Finished clipping No 1 flock. Dipped No 3 and  
took back to the Texas.

hatched a cow. a sheep died No 3 flock.

of Bequiers cows.

 sheep skin common & specimens 85 cent per kilo. potato hider 4.00.  
 Bought 2 new  from Hall @ 20.00 apiece.  
 (Lance over left here from last stop)

## 28 WEDNESDAY [301-64]

Very hot sultry day clouds to the south.  
Sutched a cow.

Sent Parth and the horse and harness to fetch a alpa cart  
brought three for 2.35. \$

Collected some manure in horse pates for use. Rufus  
harrowing it in with three hours.

Loaded the wool and hides into the three ox carts and in  
the two alpa carts. brought up bullocks from Tinias.

Took the pates from No 5 to No 4. and Maticueta oranasha  
from No 4 into stack pates. put freshly capped belts into No 5.

Johnie went to Los Rosas to meet Government inspector to confer  
about the R. R. fencing. Received a cheque from Dickinson for  
235. \$ paid for the cart <sup>the cart</sup> 302-63 FRIDAY [303-63], sent cart to the Tinias to  
fetch hides and sheep skins.

 Donald came back.

Cloudy cool weather. alfalfa dies very slowly, cut all day.  
piled up in the afternoon.

Carted earth to the beds in south pasture and in No 5 pasture.  
Pork cut 15 hells to put into his cover in No 7 and took the  
eleven hells out and put them into south pasture.  
he also sent 30 small animals put them into No 8.  
made a well rope out of hide killed yesterday.

## 6 FRIDAY (310-35)

Warm day, but heavy clouds hanging about, south east wind.  
Took all hands to the alfalfa, took two carts down.  
raked, and piled up.

Brought up twenty five animals from the Tjeras to  
put them in. butchered two animals.

Wheat looking splendid.

No work was here early this morning.

## 7 SATURDAY (311-54)

Cloudy day, could only stack half a day.  
alfa went dry

## 8 SUNDAY—24 aft Trin (312-53)

Cloudy cool day, clouds up, all day years worked  
half day piling alfalfa.  
attended service at L. house, played polo afterwards.

 their day, when they are to be taken away.

 and put them into No 8 with the 39 calves D.  
 All hands stacking alfalfa.

## 11 WEDNESDAY [315-50]

Martinmas. Scotch Quarter Day. Half  
 Quarter Day

Warm with wind. Long drying feet. stacking in  
 spot or no con.  
 Dipped No 3 flock capon flock and bouge flock.  
 one ewe dead in No 3. sawlards 43 lambs.  
 Substituting out no 300 cows he brought for us & B. & C.  
 paid the fever 19¢. & so bringing them. put them  
 into No 7, and the cows that were in No 7 put  
 into No 2.



Very warm day. Mr Johnnie went to Rosario.  
Butchered one cow.

## 13 FRIDAY [317-48]

Another very warm day. Butchered one cow.  
Mr Nash's peons arrived to take away his tropa  
to-morrow. Mr Dickinson sent over for the  
loan of a pick-ax and got it. Brought up  
a broken plough from Tijeras to be mended.

## 14 SATURDAY [318-47]

Dark cloudy forenoon, but cleared up in the  
afternoon. It rained a little last night and  
again this morning. The peons did not work in  
the alfalfa to-day. Brought up a cart load of alfalfa  
for the stable. Mr Nash's peons took his tropa away.  
360 cows and 10 bulls. They left a lame cow behind.

## 15 SUNDAY—25 aft Trin [319-46]

Warm day. Butchered one cow. One capron died  
in horse potrero. Mr<sup>rs</sup> Benitz and Mrs Macintosh  
drove over to "Santa Clara" in the afternoon.

O 10° A.M.

Beautiful weather. Johnie came back from  
Roraro. Brought a Mr Webb with him on  
a visit.

Johnie cashed the cheques for \$10,000 and the cheques  
for \$4,300. paid \$3,600 for the 300 cows bought  
and paid other bills to the amount of \$974.95  
in Roraro.

Mother went to Roraro.

## 17 TUESDAY [391-44]

Beautiful weather, wheat looking fine.

a great number of birds have hatched out.

Men getting along nicely with the affa stacking.

Two ox plows going at the times.

Sent Samuel and Donald to look for some of the  
expanses that were run towards Tuzem's estancia.

Purchased a cow.

Salvatore and Suella were here.

Johnie and Mr Webb went to Los Lomas.

Mr Webb left in the afternoon.

## 18 WEDNESDAY [392-43]

Very warm day. working hard at the affa have  
got twenty men at it.

a young lady came on a visit a Miss Smyth.

Three stone ropes four well in No 8 potatoes.



Very hot day. north wind.  
 All hands hard, at the alfa.  
 Slaughtered two animals.

## 20 FRIDAY [324-41]

Storm came up in the morning. secured a little  
 could only work half a day in the alfa.  
 Santos Requena took away 85 eighty five head of cattle  
 paid one hundred mts. on ac. of unroad.  
 Sold Cuells ten of the animals caught from  
 the Argentina.  
 Put up a shelter for the men at the alfa stacks.

## 21 SATURDAY [325-40]

Miss D. Smith left. Mother and Miss Macintosh drove  
her to the station.

From today pay the man 2.00 per day to work in  
the alfa.

Sutched a cow.

Found two novillia dead in high alfa in south  
pasture, both sides spoiled.

## 24 TUESDAY [328-327]

Foggy last night. could not work untill late  
in the alfa.

Mowing machine broke down all worn out. can  
not cut untill another arrives from B.A.

Sutched a small animal.

Put all the cattle 237 out of south pasture  
into No 7.

## 25 WEDNESDAY [329-326]

Fine hot weather. colvists beginning to cut wheat.  
Took Monte Lister manada from stack pasture to No 1. and  
Masego's from No 1 to No 8. redemans and topelles out  
of No 8 into stack pasture.



Hot sultry day. big clouds hanging about.  
 Sent horse cart to fetch new mowing machine. Model No 5 from  
 Agan cost \$41.00. set it up right off. and cut all afternoon.  
 a tiger locked in last night.

## 27 FRIDAY [331-34]

Warm day. storm clouds hanging about.  
 Could not stack today no dry alfalfa  
 butchered one animal.

## 28 SATURDAY [332-33]

Cloudy day. began to stack alfalfa in the afternoon.  
 found two of our bulls in the traps at the Independence  
 collared them together to keep them here.

Miss Macintosh went to Rosalia. Mother drove her to the station.  
 Big storm clouds about in the evening. hope it won't rain.

## 29 SUNDAY—1 in Advent [333-32]

Very hot day. stacked alfalfa half a day. raked  
 and piled up all afternoon.

Miguel Train here for beefsteak.

Sent carriage to the station for 1/2 day hay forks and  
 a bag galleter. butchered one animal.

St. Andrew, Ap.

Hot day, north wind. all hands hard at the alfalfa 23 men. have got four carts a going and two stacks at the same time.

Butchered one animal.

sent to Armstrong colony, got a male. sent to colonist to tame. sent it into alfalfa cart to work. white male has maggots in its eyes.

Ceguira took away 15 animals.

## 1 Dec TUESDAY [335-30]

● 11° 45' A.M.

Very hot day, north wind. no signs of rain. Looks like a big sea.

Worked hard at the alfalfa all day, finished a stack. Butchered one animal.

Miguel Francis here nearly all day.

St. Wash here, took away nine shells.

saltona locusts have got into front garden.

comp. is full of them.

colourants have cut about a fourth of their wheat.

## 2 WEDNESDAY [336-39]

Very hot dusty windy day. Butchered two animals. Mr Robson arrived here from England. Mr Ripley was here for tea, and then rode to Cañada de Gomez with Mr Johnnie, who went for bulls. Manuel, José rengo, and Escedro also went.



Strong south wind, quite cool, peons could not work fast in the after wind too strong.

Johnie came back. Bought from Schinberg 35 yearling bulls at \$6. - \$2.100. gave a cheque on the bank.  
 His Mauntal came back.

## 4 FRIDAY [338-39]

Beautiful weather. finished cutting alfalfa in the pig manure pastures. began to cut in the south pasture. Mr Nash here. Took away 23 cows. 13 milkers (two of which are of the quatcha var.) 36 animals in all. Slaughtered a cow.

sent cinch cart to station, for caña, yuca sugar, salt and machine oil.

## 5 SATURDAY [339-40]

Hot day. began to rake the alfalfa in north pasture. Slaughtered a vacilla.

Received 200. of Juan Requena on ac of inmanada.

Brought up Mayzapas inmanada. cut open a tumor he had under his chest and put him into stable. cured foals of mosquito.

## 6 SUNDAY - 2 in Advent [340-41]

Warm day. alfa men worked half a day. Slaughtered one animal.

M. Whisk here for breakfast.

Played polo at La Loma in the afternoon.

Strong south wind, very dry, no sign of rain, locusts eating up all the alfalfa.

Finished stacking in the pig manure pastures and moved all the carts and tools to the south pastures.

butchered one animal.

Brought up No 2 flock of sheep parted out the hams and the rams. Killed a few scabby sheep.

## 8 TUESDAY [342-343]

D 13° P.M.

Warm day again, started making two stacks in the south pastures.

Brought up No 1 and 3 flocks parted out corn and lumber, put one ham to the other over at the penit, and caponator to the others at Tjerner. Sent carriage to the station for groceries also two young stiches Bergman sent as a present. Killed an old sheep.

## 9 WEDNESDAY [343-344]

Cloudy day, rained a little in the afternoon, only worked half a day in the alfalfa.

Brought up 18 head of cattle from the Tjerner to kill. Butchered one animal.

sent cinch cart to the station to fetch a new horse rake brought in Penaric.

a troupe of muskox looked in over night.

 sent a cheque 200. to P. Lammie to get change to pay peew.

Very hot day. Another began to work in the evening.

Rec'd from Laguna 200.00  
 Hot day, rained a little in the evening.  
 Thresher thrashing Rainmonds' wheat,  
 grain small, but plenty of it.  
 Satchwood an old sheep.

## 15 TUESDAY [349-16]

0° 53° P.M.

Sent Mr. Repley 50.00 on William ac.
