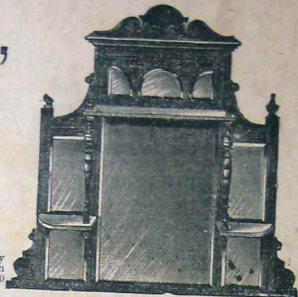

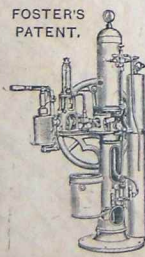

Example of a blotter page separator  
between pages of the diary. About  
half have been torn out. Copied any  
with notes, and some with arithmetic  
sums.

Hot dry dusty day. Terrible draught. cattle and sheep dying on the fine crops. people moving their cattle everywhere.

Rec. a telegram from Gault. he is in Banderoin with the 1000 now he is bringing from Junin.

Counted the cattle in No 3 pasture. 521 head cows and a few nos.

Brought up all the cattle from No 2. and parted out 411 superior calves, sent them into Pig man pasture. and the rest (yearling cattle out of P. Lewis Junin cattle.) 444 head into the stack paddock.

Bank Holiday, Scotland. Quarter Sessions.  
Week. 9 1<sup>st</sup> 41<sup>st</sup> P.M.

Terrible hot day. strong north wind all day. at night a big dust storm and a good shower of rain. pity not enough.

Hemman and peons cleaned and deepened the mill of No 6 and 7 pastures. Butchered a cow.

Two peons putting posts in place of those carried out by the deer of Beguie fence among the line.

Put milk horses into No 5. and put a (2) year old into old horse pasture. the speaking pastures from South pasture into No 3 pasture.

3 TUESDAY [3-364]

Sent and parted some animals out of Hemman's pasture.

Fine cool day. Hemman and men cleaning and deepening mill in No 2.

Butchered a cow. took 6 waddles from No 2 to Pitas to put to dull, marked 3 milch cow color. Got up two waddles to tame. Loaded up kids.

4 WEDNESDAY [4-365]

1. Sent 119 cow kids 345 calf and 3 potato kids to Alanson Hall in Paris.

Hot day.

Quello arrived at midday. 893 waddles and 75 cattle at carts. parted 385 waddles into No 6 pasture.

Brought up the capons, cut their feet and slung tails. Killed 3 kelled. Hemman and men, cleaned out mill in No 2 pastures.

Hot day. the novillos caught in Papans 1538  
 arrived at theajo hands. stopped there there, and  
 then gave them water and feed and afterwards parted  
 out. 318 of the smallest over and took them to  
 Pilaw punto. and then parted 236 of the next smallest  
 and put them into No 6 among the ones Buella  
 caught. Parted out 116 novillos of the 1st Buella  
 caught and put those also into Pilaw punto.  
 Butchred a cow.  
 Storm in the South.  
 Herman cleaned out well in No 1 pasture.

## 6 FRIDAY [6-359]

Epiphany. Twelfth Day. Old Christmas Day

Sent to Federico Roth. San Nicolas, 2 pagans, he  
 sent to have signed. one for \$11,648.59 for  
 3 months dating from Dec 21/92 due March 2/93  
 and one dating from Dec 21/92 for 6 months due  
 June 2/93 — for 8.93 now @ 5.00 and given and  
 cost of stamped paper for Pagans.

Parted at theajo hands 510 of the 1st novillos  
 sent them into South Pasture.

The rest of the novillos 505 put into No 2 pasture.  
 gave them all water.

Herman took provisions to load up salal a gaffa at  
 the station. Butchred a cow. Clearing heart  
 out of wells. Parted San station more iron from China.

## 7 SATURDAY [7-358]

Hot clear day cattle drinking a terrible  
 lot of water. but wells do not give out.

Herman loading a gaffa

Paid off all the cattle money.

Butchred a cow. 1 pasture died yearling.

1 vacilla died. 1 in Horn pasture, one of the 21<sup>st</sup>

Johni came back from Pagan.  
Morante caught and took away 27 of  
Saboteva novillios out of 106 potatoes.  
Terribly hot day. drier and drier.  
Finished loading up the alfalfa  
ten wagons 111 tons. send it to  
F.C. Marty, Pagan, he sends it to  
England, steamer "Highland Scott."

## 11 WEDNESDAY [11-354]

Hilary Law Sittings begin

Terrible hot days  
Peons cleaning and digging well in  
house potato.  
Matthe left for Alta Gracia.  
Mr. Nash here for the day.  
Sent to B. Leon, Paganimo, \$2,500. on  
acc. of the cattle caught. (Pagan)  
Rec from bank 382.00

Cool day but very much like rain, cloudy.  
 Prows being held in the sides of well in  
 to 6 and 7 feet. water running short.  
 Cattle awfully thirsty, feed all day.  
 Butchered a cow.

## 13 FRIDAY [13-352]

Clouded up, and began to rain quietly,  
 off and on all day, splended for the  
 camp. Saldeas have a rest.  
 Cleared out Pitar well, finished cleaning  
 up around well in South pasture.  
 Sent prows to part out at Las Lomas.  
 Herman left for Mar del Plata  
 for a months change, took 500. \$ along.  
 went together with Mr. Wash, in great spirits

14 SATURDAY [14-351]  
 Oxford Hilary Term begins

Clear hot day, cloudy in the evening.  
 Sold four of the old Harrow Hones to  
 P. C. Parter @ 60. \$ apiece, sent them to  
 Parter by John Haugh.  
 Butchered a cow.  
 2 sheep died;

## 15 SUNDAY - 2 aft Epiph [15-350]

Rained hard nearly all forenoon, splended  
 Mr Bell left for Paris.

Fine cool day. Coyita began digging well  
 for water in No. 6 station by this gate.  
 The men hauled bricks for road.  
 Josue and three men marking off  
 line for fence in new alfalfa, marking  
 off places for wells.  
 Three sheep died. 1 nor Sabatena died.  
 Butchered a cow.

## 17 TUESDAY [17-348]

## 18 WEDNESDAY [18-347]

Fine cool day.  
 Bought bricks for 1000 at town and  
 began to cart with bellah carts to  
 the new pasture.

Fine weather, if it only would rain.  
Finished hauling bricks from station to new  
puroto 2,000.

Carted out material for fencing along R.R. line.  
took the Cavilla and from down land began  
to fence.

Butchered a cow.

gave colicist eleven mules to tame.  
Mr. H. Macintosh came out from Rosario.

## 20 FRIDAY [20-345]

Terrible hot day, storm in the evening but  
no rain, getting awfully dry.

Set up new gate on new fence. by R.R. crossing.  
Butchered a cow.

Carted bricks for burial of well.

Hot day, storm in the evening, rained a little.  
fencing.

Butchered.

a novillie died in No 7

Pump in patio out of order.

## 22 SUNDAY—3 aft Epiph [22-343]

Rained quite a lot in the night,  
did a lot of work.

Cloudy all day.

Butchered the cow.

Beautiful cool day.

Marion and two boys began building  
piers at Texas gate.

Fencers finished fence along R.R. since  
began to remove the 1/2 acre boundary  
fence between Dennis and us.

Cutting alfalfa in front of the house.  
a threshing began work in our camp.

Patched a cow.

carried material to the fencers.

carried zinc and wood from station to piers.

W. Minton left. a Mrs. White from Pasco  
came on a few days.

24 TUESDAY [24-341]

Fine sunny day.

Eric and Agnes came out.

Patched a cow.

Put all the cattle in patches on poles.

carrying material to fencers.

started the gate at R.R. crossing.

25 WEDNESDAY [25-340]

Conversion of St. Paul. } 6:27 A.M.

Fine weather. cool night.

Juan came here sheared him cattle.

Patched a cow.

Carried new shovels to Pilas well.

sent to station for groceries.

Hot sultry day, storm in the evening,  
rained a good shower.  
Set up the new troughs at Pilars points.  
Ramón receiving the wheat from Calouists.  
Ladies went out driving.

## 27 FRIDAY [27-338]

Beautiful day. Exported the first wheat to the  
station, to Böttlinger's galpon.

Exported material to the fence, sent to the  
station for revenues.

Butchered,

The old pacing trotter, Laguna's mare, died  
must have been 26 years old.

## 28 SATURDAY [28-337]

North wind hot, and sultry.

Brought up all the flocks, parted out the lambs  
put them into capon and bodega flocks, dipped  
the bodega flock, classified the sheep, killed two  
capon.

Butchered a cow.

Sultry day. Mr. White and children left  
to Bordas. Major and John's drive to station.  
Butchered a cow.

Hot sultry day. looks like rain.  
Sabatini has here received \$1000 from him.  
Sent material to the printer.

## 31 TUESDAY (31-334)

Hot clear day, no rain.  
Finished repairing stove. Remmie's boards.  
Miguel Benavente took out away 150 \$  
calves he gave him cash \$1.60, over a  
100. \$ on ac.

Rained a very hard shower. 4 hours.  
1 Feb WEDNESDAY (1-334)  
Drove to Santa Beguina 500 head of cattle  
Partridge and Pheasant Shooting ends. O 2 11<sup>o</sup> A.M.  
in No 3 party. color vacillas novillitas.  
at 25. \$ each. he pays \$1000. more. plus para  
near 2 monts from date. these cattle are bought  
from B. Lora, Jimin, @ \$11.00

Received a telegram from Mr. Nash from  
Mar del Plata at 2 P.M. saying that  
Herman had died there last night  
at 9 P.M.  
Johnnie left for Sta Lucia to speak news to  
mother, and from there went Mar del Plata.

Beautiful day. William left for Landa. Carted hat over pots and raffles.

Began fencing line from Ruente corner to mazon near San Juan Puerto.

Butchered a cow.

beat up one of the big alcaons. looked and inkechador.

a sheep died No 8 pasture No 1 flock.

Pasture coming on beautifully after the rain.

## 8 WEDNESDAY [39-398]

Half Quarter Day. ( 8<sup>h</sup> 12<sup>m</sup> p.m.

Beautiful day. set up a gate on the new fence.

Bought 6 horses from Puffy @ \$27.00

Carted wheat to the station and pots and raffles sack. carted bricks from station to new well. carted lime and sand to new Puerto.

Butchered a cow.

Been getting along fine with fence.

Minton left for Buenos. gave him \$250.00 to deposit in London bank.

Beautiful day. Carted bricks to new well.  
Carted over railings and posts. 2 bullock carts.  
horse cart scattering fencing material.  
Butchered a cow.

Salvatorena took away the last of his own &  
Receiving wheat and carting to station.  
2 carpenter 1 blacksmith working in shop.  
2 men boring railings.

## 10 FRIDAY [41-326]

Fine weather, finished 1/2 logue fencing to Perm fence.  
started another 1/2 logue fence from corner of quinta.  
to center of logue.

Carted bricks and fencing material. rec. wheat.  
Butchered a cow.  
a patro broke its leg. accident.

## 11 SATURDAY [42-327]

Rec. from Requena 1,000. \$ as money for the 500 premium  
cows sold to him.

Carted over fencing material.

Butchered a bullock. cut its hide, traded it for  
a colonist for a moolah. sent to station for lumber.  
Paid bull No 100. \$ cow on cattle.

## 12 Quinquagesima SUNDAY [43-328]

Spent around from the Mass.

Began to rain at noon. rained quietly for  
several hours.

Butchered a cow.

A big storm at night rained a great deal.  
 wind broke limb down in the garden.  
 could not fence. carted material over from  
 the station.  
 Mr Watt Jr. here for Seabrook.

14 Shrove **TUESDAY** [45-320]  
 St. Valentine

Beautiful day. affairs getting  
 splendid. fences only would be a  
 day.  
 Sutchwood a cow.  
 Ladies drove over to Borthings.

15 Ash **WEDNESDAY** [46-319]  
 First Day of Lent

Rained very hard again last night.  
 splendid weather. anything changed.  
 fences cannot work fast.  
 Set up digging to clear out well in 1844.  
 Sutchwood a cow.  
 Mr Water here on a visit.

Beautiful weather. ● 17<sup>th</sup> P.M.

Will diggers cleaned and deepened well in No 4.  
Received eight bullocks, tanned by colonists,  
got ploughs ready for transport.  
Brought tripella of days from pasture, cut lampers  
and feet, also put our man on them  
Set up another trough at well in South pasture.  
Fences worked all day.  
Received wheat from colonists, sent one load  
to the station.  
Bought a horse from some bondsmen. \$32.00  
Butchered a cow.

## 17 FRIDAY [48-317]

Cloudy, stormy looking weather.  
Mayson and his two partners drove to Languis.  
Received wheat from colonist.  
Laying damp wheat.  
Started two ploughs in new pig pasture.  
Carted from station 45 bags 1000 kilos all performed.  
Changed Chaco novillia 479 from No 1 to No 4.  
put all the novillia in pastures on road. counted  
and ran them. South Pasture 516. 265-222  
No 6 498 - No 2-508 now. all fattening very fast.

## 18 SATURDAY [49-316]

Beautiful day.  
started a show resowing <sup>also</sup> sets of land that had  
been mired in the colony.  
Butchered a cow.  
took the cattle out of the stack and have pastures 456  
put them into No 1 pasture.

19 SUNDAY—1 in Lent [50-315]  
Ember Week

Cloudy sultry day.  
butchered a cow, also a capon.  
Brought up all the manure, separated the  
stallions.

Sent Fr. C. Marty \$55.20 cheque for sofa and  
 Sent B. Louis Bergamini \$2459. " " cattle ac.  
 Parted 11 novillias from South pasture and  
 thirteen from No 6, put them into No 2. parted  
 26 from No 2 into No 4. Parted 35 from No 7  
 into No 6. and 24 from No 6 into Horse pasture.  
 Butchered a cow.  
 a calf died in rignau pasture also 2 caponsites.  
 Ladies drove over to Las Lomas.

## 21 TUESDAY [52-313]

Beautiful weather.

Santos Ceguira shot us a load of 25 water melons.

Began to plow in the punto at new punto.

Cart shot over a boy with two Raneros ploughs and fifty rolls wire.

Sent two loads of wheat to the station every day

The two Sulista ploughs doing good work.

one man sowing alfalfa in potatoes that were missed.

Maying came back from Ranero.

Butchered a cow.

a boega died No 3 flock.

## 25 SATURDAY [56-309]

Ember Day

Hot day. Finished the work at the Punto de

la Laguna. Shot up canals to wall in bays in No 8 potteries to fix up fence.

Sent home cart to station for stores.

Three threshers working in the camp.

Butchered a cow. Ceguira shot 149 more to summer

@ 1.50 per month but them into No 3 among cows he bought.

26 SUNDAY—2 in Lent [57-308]

Hot day.

Mothel and Maying went out driving.

a sheep died No 7 potteries No 3 flock.

Cloudy sultry weather. none.  
 Packed from the Tiquan No 1 pasture 28 cows with  
 calf at foot B.H., and 99 of the small animals  
 of the Juvin cattle at corte, put them into  
 the Pigmans pasture, and the B.H. into the old  
 horse pasture.

Butchered a cow.

Received wheat and sent to the station.

Shot over the grape stone for Mannans grave.

Bought from Dickman 5 bulls at 60.¢ piece  
 L mark. they are of cattle he shot up from B.H.  
 put them into Pigmans pasture.

28 TUESDAY [59-308]

Hare Hunting ends

Very hot day. getting dry again.

Packed out all the morillas out of Pishes  
 cows in No 5 put them into No 1.

Put all the cattle on roads.

Butchered a vacilla

moved the vacilla to the cañada and continued  
 work on the fence. with the sun.

one of the threshers left our camp. and  
 another came in this morning.

1 March WEDNESDAY [60-309]

David, Abp.

Hot day. roads very dusty -

Packed out at Pilas 110 morillas and  
 put them among these in No 6 pasture.

Carts brought over vacilla.

Shot to the Independencia and caught up  
 a bull and a toumo from there.

Butchered a cow.

one of Pishes cows died in No 5.

O 4<sup>30</sup> P.M.

Hot sultry day, getting very dry.  
cutting wheat.  
B. Leone from Paganino here.

## 3 FRIDAY [62-305]

Hot day. Sent B. Leone to the Commania in  
the carriage.  
Mr. Cortesello came to see the capons from San Nicolas.  
Sold them to him @ \$5.00 to take of receipt of an  
average of 55 lbs. time 15 days to take away in.  
we paid 2,000.¢ cash as usual. made a sale.  
a sheep died to 3 flock. and a capon in capon flock.  
Miguel Fraine here for the night.  
Bought four hares for rabbits @ 30. each, for the Tigua  
and a pony for job @ 50.¢  
Butchered a cow.

## 4 SATURDAY [63-306]

Very hot day.  
Sent 1,300. to Agua for Glass.  
Bought a cow W from Los Trancas camp.

Mr Land came, have lived here as Magador at 100¢ a month.

Sent horse cart to the station for stores.

Butcher four town took away from the Texas No 1 potter five animals @ 11.8 each

## 14 TUESDAY [73-292]

Beautiful weather, nice cool day.

Finished ploughing the quinta at the Puerto de la Laguna.

In the afternoon stabled one of the new S.M.F. ploughs with 4 horses in front of the house, in the past quinta.

Set up the poles and potteries and wrote letters manaba and began to eat them, to send them to the Chaco.

Butched a cow.

Dogs killed 5 sheep. (Soyas) in south potteries.

## 15 WEDNESDAY [74-291]

Finished putting together the animals to be sent to the Chaco. 118 in all manaba stallions foals potter potteries and horses.

Set up the gate on the Linceo fence running east and west.

Mr Pink arrived from Landa

Mother and Maryam drove to the station.
