of me Charles Richards of the Parish

I direct my Executors hereinafter named

Testamentary expenses as soon as Conveniently
may be after my decease.

I give devise and bequeath unto my
dear Wife Marie Adelaide, All the residue
of my real and personal estate whatever
and wheresoever situate which may be left
after the payment of my just Debts Funeral
and Testamentary expenses To hold the same
unto her for her own absolute use and
benefit according to the respective natures
and qualities of the said premises for and
during the term of her natural life but
with full power to sell and dispose of all
or such part of my said real and personal
estate as from time to time she may think
expedient And from and after the decease
of my said Wife I direct that my Executor
for the time being shall divide the then
residue (if any) of my said real and
personal estate between my Son William
Henry, and my three Daughters Isabel Maria,
Cornelia Valila, and Julia Maria in
equal shares and proportions And I also

direct that if either of my said children shall happen to die before my said Wife then the share to which such child so dying would have been entitled if living shall be divided equally between my then surviving children share and share alike.

And I hereby appoint my said Wife to be Guardian of my children and sole executrix during her life of this my Will And from and after the decease of my said Wife I direct that my son the said William Henry Richards shall become sole Executor of this my Will and the same shall take effect and be executed in the same or in a like manner as if my said son had been originally appointed the sole executor But in the event of my said Wife predeceasing my said son then and in such case my said Wife shall have full power to appoint any person in whom she has sufficient trust and confidence to be Executor of this my Will.

And lastly I revoke all former and

other Wills, Codicils, Testamentary dispositions and appointments whatsoever by me at any time heretofore made and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

In Witness whereof I have herewith set my hand this Seventeenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight.
