soon, brought up all the tools and
paid off the men.

Blacksmith was the only man that did any
work today.

Shot down the greyhound, son of old. Boney
we got from San Rosas. he was getting too savage.
put Kawyer manada from stack pasture into
guiguan pasture. and all the peeco horses
into stack pasture also new saddle (19) horses.

12 TUESDAY [103-263]

Cleared up a beautiful day.

Changed Karkis novillos from 105 to the south pasture
and animals unbrushed.

Received \$216.00 from Laguna for mormada.

Cut up a hide for making gear to stoniar with.
