 finished mowing with fence of house pasture, and
 began to build a new fence around a piece of
 beloved land. intended to sow alfalfa seed in
 pasture seeds in.

29 FRIDAY [211-155]

Windy all day. started a man harrowing the
 land before sup last year. (with subsoiler,) and
 a man harrowing with harrow in the house
 pasture.
 Slaughtered a cow.
 carted alfalfa seed from the station.
 wheat coming up fine.

30 SATURDAY [212-154]

Windy, misty day, with wind.
 Killed two chickens.
 down left.
 carted guano and alfalfa seed from the station.

31 SUNDAY—7 aft Trin [213-153]
7¹⁵ 45¹⁵ P.M.

South wind, tem. cool, rained a great
 deal during the night, and off and on
 nearly all day.
 Chilled and Jean Sam had breakfast here

Lammas Day. Scotch Quarter Day. Bank
Holiday. Royal Academy closes

Rained hard all night and all
day. Terrible mud and mess. Some
heating with a view.
peas cleaning parais seeds.
satched a cow.
Sawpeter and Blackwith busy in the shop.
no mail today.

2 TUESDAY [215-151]

Raining as hard as ever.
William and his gentlemen arrived
from Lunka.
peas cleaning parais seeds.
making in the shop.

3 WEDNESDAY [216-150]

Rained hard all night. Sun cleared
up beautifully in the afternoon.
killed a capon
found some sheep outside of the camp.
one of the big rams dead.
satched a cow.
Miss Macintosh drove to the station to see her sister.
brought up a load of dry alfa for the shop.

Beautiful day. carted a wagon load of wood over
with the milk and horse carts.
found some more sheep and cattle outside of the
camp.
a sheep got killed by the train.

Sketches a cow.
Loaded up 92 holes to send to Paraná.
Began to plow again in the same potato.

Beautiful day. north wind.
Sent 92 cow holes to Alvarado Hall 850 kilos.
sold 20.00 Salado alfalfa
Mr and Mrs Birmingham came on a visit.
Paid freight bills. Horse carts carted over 120 pots.
Began sowing paraisi seeds.

7 SUNDAY—8 aft Trin [920-146]

Beautiful day. great Auction Sales at
the station. Special train. Lots of people.
Bought from Lemmie 11 Hampshire rams
@ \$5.00 apiece.
Mr and Mrs Egan and Clara came up from B.H.

Clouding up. Began to rain in the evening.

 a lot of cattle looked in coal.
 Slaughtered up ten chickens from Plover.

10 WEDNESDAY [143-143]

Cold day. north wind, cloudy.
 Succeeded 8 pigs.
 Began to sow coffee and in the heavy patches
 started two single plough with the horse.

Fine weather. Agar shooting partridges
cut up the pigs.

12 FRIDAY [1295-1411]

Grouse Shooting begins. Trinity Law Sittings
end

Clear, hot in the morning. Fine for the week.
went out riding and driving, drove to Las Ran-
chas smashed the wagonette all to pieces.
Went to Las Ran to fetch the 11 cows bought.
Sutched a cow, hawking ploughing and
sowing of the seed.
caught up a puma to tame.
a mare of Solomon manaba died.

13 SATURDAY [1296-1401]

Beautiful day. Mr Agar out shooting in the
afternoon visitors rode to Las Lunas.
carted a load of affa into here patero.
carted the load of timber from station.
parted 105 cows from No Point No 6. sold 21
bullocks to Forber at 60.¢.

14 SUNDAY—9 aft Trin [1297-1397]

Fine warm day.
Inaugurated the new polo ground at Las
Ran station. Ladies drove over, made tea on
the ground.
Sutched a cow.

C @ 37th A.M.

Cold south wind,
 started out of No. 3, 20 animals to butcher
 Sutchewd a vacquillona,
 killed a capon and a sucking pig to
 send to Buenos Aires.
 William Clair and the Oggar and Mr. Paine
 left for P. S.
 Baling machine began work again.

16 TUESDAY [1898-1898]

Cold nasty, stormy east wind.
 one of the lecheras cows died.
 Two single plows the roller and harrow working.
 Rufino sewing jeans suits.
 carted a load of alfalfa into horse pasture
 and one with No. 5 potatoes for the mules.
 Lonkin with plow and cart and tab
 and loa went to work on the polo ground.
 Brought up the capon flock, cleaned tubs
 and feet counted 550 capons and 10 little
 rams. Sutchewd a capon.
 Blacksmith and carpenter busy mending carriage.

17 WEDNESDAY [1898-1898]

Fine day. Mr. Carpenter and some friends here
 for breakfast.
 Juan Lanes, Sutchew, washer looking for cattle.
 did not do a deal.
 Cleaned tubs and cut feet of the flock, and wash
 20 lambs, flock counted 1114 head.
 began to cart baled alfalfa.
 Sutchewd a cow.
 gave to Bartista Lopez 10 lecheras muttons
 to tame as bellwethers.

It was a cloudy day. We cleaned tail and cut feet and resealed lambs.

In the afternoon we put pains at gathering pariro seed. Butchered a cow. Barte made two trips to Station with alfa. Johne went into Rosario. It commenced to drizzle a little. Johne went to Rosario.

19 FRIDAY [1882-1883]

This morning it rained a little we put the pains at gathering pariro seed.

In afternoon we cleaned tail and cut feet resealed 43 lambs. we did not get finished. Barte only made one trip with alfa. We butchered a cow and a sheep that got broke. Carpenter washed the carriage and the smith made a bucket.

Therman went down to the baling machine it is doing slow work.

Englan came and got ten dollars to cure his brother that is sick over at town.

20 SATURDAY [1883-1884]

Black Game Shooting begins

Beautiful day. finished clearing No 3 flock. marked 125 lambs.

Butchered a cow.

Took a new bucket to well of No 6 and No 7. Carpenter building a caulka.

21 SUNDAY—10 aft Trin [1884-1885]

Cloudy windy day. looks rainy.

Sold to Antonio Limenez. 15 calan BL @ 9.00

and 30 regullinas EN @ 20.00 — 735.00

Played polo at station.

● 10^h 50^m A.M.

Cold north wind, rained a little in the afternoon.

Received 535.00 for the cattle sold yesterday.

Paid Manuel Sosa 196.00 interest on 2,500.00 from Sept 4th to Sept 2nd 92.

Slaughtered a cow.

a great many mares are slipping their foals.

Finished sowing parais seeds.

Mr Robinson and Mr. White breakfasted here.

Sent to the Refugio for the stallion exchanged for Solomon. Sent Nicolovich a cheque 600.00 ac. cattle

23 TUESDAY [1896-130]

Beautiful sunny day.

Mr Parker and a Mr Bisset came up in the train from B.A.

Mr and Mrs Mayatt's here for the night.

Sent cart for terringtons and plough repairs bought in Paraiso, also a roller.

Put Solomon into the stable.

a potranca died in No 7 potrero.

a butcher had breakfast here. did not do business.

24 WEDNESDAY [1897-129]

St Bartholomew, Ap.

Fine warm day. Mr Parker and Mr Bisset

left. also Mr and Mrs Mayatt.

John's 3rd son the day, eat his usual turkey from transplanting parais trees.

Slaughtered a cow.

caught up a potro.

Hot north wind. Collected the parano seeds in with the new roller.

Miss Macintosh went to spend the day at her sister at the hotel.

Caught a cow.

Miss Dickson and another lady, called in the afternoon.

Mr Davidson here for the night.

Three batches here looking for fat cattle.

Four persons transplanting trees.

Found a colt at Las Pomas.

26 FRIDAY [339-127]

Cold south wind. Three men mowing garden fence. Two single ploughs and the harrowing going in the same pattern. Two double ploughs and harrow working at the tygar. The mule carts making the trip daily to station with Cal's crop. I have cut with fence making on pole ground at station. Other have cut doing ordinary work. Calisto Cecilia and Ramon tanning potatoes. I saw tanning station at the tygar. I saw hewing logs. Manuel and John Haugh doing horse back work. I saw looking after 2 east stallion and stable. Blacksmith mending ploughs - carpenter making cart. Herman mending the gates. Aguirre drove over after Mrs Mainish. I found nest and saw Mr. Tommas on Summers.

27 SATURDAY [340-126]

Fine day. Mother visited all day at Las Pomas. Sent Ramon to take charge of the men working on the pole ground at the station.

Parted out the 2 patrollers left for stallions. put them into the station paddocks.

28 SUNDAY - 11 aft Trin [341-125]

Sold to Calabrera all the cows but 50 in No 6 pasture EN @ 22.50 \$ apiece 2 months time to take. also 200 calves out of No 2 pasture @ 8.00 \$ with two months time to take out.

Beautiful day. very heavy black
 frost this morning.
 Some one stole the down bed and covers from
 one of the mule carts, last night, probably
 from.
 Horse cart carrying over raullas from the station
 hitched a cow.
 set a man at boring raullas.
 Mr Robinson here to the.

30 TUESDAY [243-133]

Began to cross plough with two horse (double) ploughs. also put the sullock ploughs at cross ploughing.

killed two capons. sent one to Eggar. P.M. cleaned the rams tail and feet.

one of the mule carts smashed up.

10 SATURDAY [254-112]

Very cold south wind. very changeable nasty weather

Finished renewing the south fence. moved the cart along the fence into No 7 pasture.

butchered a cow.

Took material down to the fences.

Johnnie and Miss Mayoy got engaged to be married

11 SUNDAY—13 aft Trin [255-111]
Ember Week

Three calm days. played polo.

Ladies took tea over.

Fine day. Carted material down to the general.

Brought up all the manadas, remade them classifying the manas, put in all the potancas. Manages 60 manas. Mate Cruz 60 manas. Miquipa 50 manas, and the station traded for Salomon 25, in all 205 manas. Mark sent and took Salomon away.

Butchered a cow.

Sent to the station for stores.

Mason began work, fixing up the pump in the back yard, put a peon at cutting out sod weeds **13 TUESDAY [857-109]** at Potosi suesta.

(0° 50' P.M.)

North wind, same day, but partly morning brought up tambora cattle from Potosi suesta, marked 13 calves, put 11 tubos into horse potancas, and 25 saquillas and novillitos into No. 8 potancas.

Sent the Saling machine and engine back to Las Lomas. Finished carting the sales.

Butchered a vaquillera.

one of Mr. Washes novillitos died.

Douglas rode to C. de Sanga.

14 WEDNESDAY [858-108]

Ember Day

North wind, getting warm, very dry.

 the first of October and the rest at the end
 of October, made a boleto.
 Manuel France and other butchers were
 here.

started this morn digging a well at present
